





NEWS IN SPAIN

even Britons arrested in Spain for satellite TV fraud in the coastal area of Orihuela for distributing pirated television signals to more than 15,000 clients, most of them also British. The Guardia Civil made the arrests in several urbanisations on Tuesday, starting at 9.30am in Urbanisation Laguna III in the area of Punta Prima. Telecommunications and computer material was seized



the area. Several clients told the Guardia Civil that they were indeed customers of the group, but that they did not know the service was unauthorised. The seven arrested face initial charges of crimes against intellectual property and tax fraud. More arrests in the case have not been ruled out.

5-year-old has kidney removed through navel An 85-year-old woman with renal cancer has become the first Spanish patient to have a kidney removed through a single 4cm incision in the navel, vet another advance in keyhole surgery. The head of urology at the Hospital Clínic in Barcelona, Antonio Alcaraz, made a statement to the press today saying that the operation, known correctly as a transumbilical nephrectomy, had taken place on February 17th and that the patient, Severina, from Barbastro (Huesca) had been sent home just three days later. Alcaraz told the press that only a dozen similar operations had been carried out in the world, but that it was hoped that this method would be used more and more in the future for patients without complications as there was a much smaller risk of haemorrage than with conventional laporoscopic surgery, there was little or no scarring and it caused minimal pain. The operation lasted just over two and a half hours. with surgeons also removing an umbilical hernia, which was discovered during the course



of the intervention. Last year, the same team of surgeons performed the world's first transvaginal nephrectomy (when a cancerous kidney was removed via the vagina), another minimally invasive procedure that requires only two 1cm incisions in the abdomen and another invisible one in the inside of the vagina. Since this first successful operation the team have extracted another 12 kidneys via the vagina, a route which is now being considered for transplanting live kidneys. For Dr Alcaraz, transumbilical surgery means another step forward in laparoscopic surgery and he added that whereas the transvaginal procedures only benefitted women patients, transumbilical procedures were an advancement for surgery on male patients too. Until laparoscopic devices were invented, removing a kidney involved making a 15-18cm incision in a patient's abdomen, which meant a much longer and more painful recovery period.

been achieved. Epigenetics is already offering enormous possibilities in the fight against certain illnesses like cancer. and in the search for anti-ageing treatments. Various experiments carried out by IBIDELL-ICO in Catalunya on yeast, worms, flies and mice have shown that it is possible to increase their normal life-expectancy rates by as much as 50%, as Manel Esteller, director of the epigenetics program, explained. The challenge, he said, was to find a genetic 'equilibrium' which allows risk-free cell reproduction, i.e. achieve an increase in life-expectancy of cells without causing any irreparable genetic damage, like tumours. The possibilities offered by epigenetics to reprogram the genome without altering DNA form the basis of new technologies, with an enormous potential to increase cell-life expectancy and cure a wide range of illnesses, not only cancer, but also cardiovascular and



neurological illnesses. One of the areas being investigated is the genetic modifications caused by sirtuins, molecules that deacetylase histones, of the proteins that regulate DNA. In cancer cells.

these proteins are abundant, making the cells almost immortal. Sirtuins are also known to be implicated in

calorie intake, which also has implications for longevity since organisms that eat less, live longer. A classic sirtuin activator is resveratrol, found in red wine, which has been shown to increase life-expectancy, and scientists are working to develop more potent forms of this molecule, which could then be administered in smaller doses with greater efficiency and fewer side effects. 'Our current investigations are centred on achieving an equilibrium between increasing life-expectancy without causing cancer, and the results so far have been very encouraging' said Esteller

Newer planes will have three inch-wide piss-gutters running down each side of the aisle

BUDGET airline Ryanair is to introduce the overwhelming stench of bodily waste to its 145 routes across Europe.

The company said that by removing the toilets, adding extra seats and transforming its planes into flying cesspits it was simply keeping pace with customer expectations.

Chief executive Michael O'Leary said: "Passengers should feel free to urinate on their seats or into a cup which they can then hand to the cabin crew who will be going up and down the aisle with a couple of buckets.

RABIES THREAT

A group of veterinarians from the provinces of Cádiz and Malaga have issued a rabies alert! Thousands of dogs in the area around Gibraltar, within an area of an approximate radius of about 80 kilometres, have

been certified - with properly stamped and signed rabies vaccination booklets - as having been vaccinated against rabies without ever having seen a veterinarian or having been vaccinated! These are primarily hunting dogs, as the hunters have the misconception that the vaccine against rabies alters or destroys the dogs' sense of smell! This is a particular danger because it is at the centre of an area of high transit to and from North Africa, Ceuta and Morocco, where there are cases of Rabies. There is a veterinarian in the Algeciras area presumably implicated in this fraud who sells vaccination books signed and stamped without vaccinating the dog cited in the book.

Rabies is a fatal infectious disease transmitted in the saliva of an infected carrier, most often by biting a healthy noninfected individual. At the present time, it is eradicated in Spain but not in Ceuta, Melilla, or Morocco. In 2004 preventative measures were stepped up due to a case of infection in Morocco of an Austrian citizen, and an outbreak was detected in France, caused by a dog that came from Africa via the area around Gibraltar.

The complaint against the implicated veterinarian supposedly perpetrating this fraud is under investigation. It was first brought to the attention of some authorities as far back as 1993, however, the Prosecutors Office of Algeciras has only recently taken the matter under more serious

consideration.and headway some is finally being



made through the bureaucratic and legal quagmire. This hopefully will put an end to the fraud and thereby avoid the potential threat of a Rabies outbreak at best or an epidemic at worst!

Animal Protection Laws

Last December a dog was found near death, in a plastic bag in a dustbin in the San Cugat area of Barcelona. According to a local judge, armed with the Catalonian Animal Protection Statutes, this is a serious crime and not just a minor offence.

The dog, Buc a 5-year-old Boxer, was diagnosed with an incurable open sore over its rib cage and was suffering. The veterinarian told the owner that euthanasia was the only solution and would cost 180 Euros. The owner being a pensioner felt that was more than he could afford and took Buc home. A neighbour offered to help by killing Buc and burying him, to which the owner agreed, despite the sorrow of losing his companion. A few days later and due to Bucs' microchip, the town police were able to locate the owner to inquire how Buc was in a dustbin in such a state. The neighbour confessed to his part and took responsibility for the 350 Euro cost of treating and finally euthanizing Buc. The prosecution is seeking proper application of the animal rights laws for the trial scheduled for 27 April. A guilty verdict could mean 3 months to one year in prison.

The owner insists that he really loved his dog. It was not his intention that Buc suffer, but that he felt that the solution offered by his neighbour was the only realistic one for him and for Buc, he felt betrayed by his neighbour.





Gallbladder 34 (Master Point for the tendons & muscles): below the knee, one inch below and in front of the head of the Tibia, which runs up the side of the leg

– helps Liver maintain

Triple Warmer TW5: 3 finger-widths above the wrist on the outside of the arm in the dip between the 2 bones

- tendinitis, wrist pain

Large Intestine 11: by the elbow where crease ends when you bend it

- clears Heat, elbow pain

Large Intestine L14: (Note: don't use this point if pregnant, as it can start contractions) in the web between thumb and 1st finger, at the highest point when you squeeze them together

- analgesic, anti-inflammatory

Stomach ST36: on the outside of the leg just out from the shin bone, 4 finger widths below the base of the kneecap

- knee pain, helps Blood & Qi circulation

Liver LIV3: between the 1st & 2nd toes, run your finger up to where it can go no further & press in

- boosts the Liver for flexibility of tendons

Next month I will outline more of the local points to treat specific joint problems to add to these core muscular-skeletal support points. The local area acupoints help increase circulation, reducing inflammation & gradually increasing joint movement & comfort.

So, good luck & here's to dancing when we are 80!

NEWS FROM OUR CALIFORNIA CORRESPONDENT (NORFOLK)

"Very flat, Norfolk", was a remark made by a character in Noel Coward's "Private Lives". Well, that's not strictly true, there are some bumpy bits, and around some of the edges it is getting dangerously close to disappearing below sea level. In fact it has already been proposed that some parts of the Broads area, a popular tourist destination, should be turned over to the sea and flooded.

Norfolk folk, obviously want to conserve their flat landscape, and seem to have an aversion to anything that sticks up more than a few feet off the ground. When a proposal is

made to erect a mobile phone mast the natives will certainly rise up in anger. Previous objections to these necessities of modern life where previously focussed on the "it will

fry our brains" argument. There was an apparent belief that people would be rendered insensible and their children, in particular, would become mindless zombies and bump into the furniture. Now there are a significant number of kids like that already having been dosed on a regular basis with drugs to combat ADHD. Or "naughty kids disease" as I prefer to call it. Nevertheless, either to dispel the theory or out of necessity, mobile masts appear on the top of council flats and hospital buildings because no real scientific evidence of "brain frying" exists. Campaigners have had to resort to other methods of protest in order to rid their area of this supposed "evil".

Having failed to make any headway on the dangerous "rays" theory the next argument to be put forward is about the physical appearance of things. Although many are little more conspicuous than your average streetlight it has to

be agreed that they do stick up in the air. Such goings-on are not in line with the Norfolk flat-earth theory. Although they can be disguised as other things, like trees for example, they are still objected to on a regular basis even though we now seem to live in a society with one ear glued permanently to a mobile phone and therefore have to rely on the things being built somewhere.

But a far greater evil has arrived to



besmirch the landscape. The world energy crisis has brought about the need for alternative energy sources and with this has come the innovation of the "wind farm". The

introduction of the first wind generator to Norfolk was seen as a novelty. It was the centre attraction of the Ecotec Centre, a well-meaning theme park designed to educate people about the benefits of recycling. However the joys of discovering that you could grow vegetables in recycled human 'poo' somehow failed to equal the attractions of Alton Towers and the centre closed leaving only the major exhibit which was a large wind generator. Not only could the natives go to point at this magnificent

piece of engineering, but they could ascend the tower and point down. I should explain that Norfolk people like things to point at. "Look Mummy, the lights are changing colour all on their own, red, amber and green, is it magic?","Hush my child, they are called traffic lights and are powered by dark forces". When the M25 was opened they even ran coach trips to enable local people to gaze upon it, and point.

But I digress. Having one wind generator to point at was one thing but "farms" of them was quite another. Now I have seen the forests of turbines on Spanish hillsides and I can assure you that plans for developments locally are on a much smaller scale. Probably ten machines at the most. Nevertheless planning applications are opposed on a regular basis. The noise will be a disturbance, is one argument. What about the birds? Won't they fly into them? Another fear was they would disturb the radar system which scans the skies over Norfolk. Now I'm left to wonder what kind of air security system we have that fails to determine

the difference between a moving 747 and a stationary windmill, but there you go. Plans are submitted by individual farmers trying to scratch a living from their land to major industrialists like Lotus and Bernard Matthews. Obviously the turkey powered generators are not up to the job. All these applications are met with disapproval at some point. The benefits of saving the planet do not come into the argument at all. The overriding objection is that they

will stick up in the air and spoil the view. The view of what? For the most part there is little view to spoil, and actually I find these windmills quite elegant.

The only exception to these objections is the construction of wind farms off the coast. The Scroby Sands development is comfortably placed a mile offshore. The turbines are seen more as a tourist attraction rather than a major contribution to minimise the effects of global warming. Something you can easily point at, and from a safe distance well out of reach of plummeting seagulls!

Now you may agree that the locals have a point.

Maybe they want to preserve the landscape as it has always been. But you would be missing one factor here. For hundreds of years the Norfolk landscape has been dotted with windmills of all kinds. They ground the corn,

dotted with windmills of all kinds. They ground the corn, and pumped the water into the dykes to keep huge parts of the landscape dry which are below sea level. Without


them the North Norfolk coast and the productive fenlands of the Cambridgeshire borders would not exist. The ruins of these mills still stand, and in some cases have been rebuilt as holiday homes. Of course they are a lot smaller than the megaliths that generate todays power. The uses to which windmills are put may have changed, but the need to harness the power of nature still has its uses; this time to help save the planet.

aint George is one of the most venerated saints in the Anglican Church, Eastern Orthodox Church, Oriental Orthodox Churches, and the Eastern Catholic Churches. He is immortalised in the tale of George and the Dragon and is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. His memorial is celebrated on 23 April. He is regarded as one of the most prominent military saints.

St. George is the patron saint of Aragon, Catalonia, England, Ethiopia, Georgia, Greece, Lithuania, Palestine, Portugal, and Russia, as well as many cities.

The Life and Death

George was born to a Christian noble family during the late third century between about 275 AD and 285 AD, in Lydda, Palestine. His father Geronzio was a Roman army official from Cappadocia and his mother was from Palestine. They were both Christians and from noble families of Anici (which means "can not be defeated"), so by this the child was raised with Christian beliefs.

In the year AD 302, Diocletian (influenced by Galerius) issued an edict that every Christian soldier in the army should be arrested and every other soldier should offer a sacrifice to the Pagan gods. But George objected and with the courage of his faith approached the Emperor and ruler. Diocletian was upset, not wanting to lose his best soldier and the son of his best official, Geronzio. George loudly renounced the Emperor's edict, and in front of his fellow

his worship of Jesus Christ, Diocletian attempted to convert George, even offering gifts of land, money and slaves if he made a sacrifice to the Pagan gods. The Emperor made many offers, but George never accepted.

Recognizing the futility of his efforts, Diocletian was left with no choice but to have him executed for his refusal. Before the execution George gave his wealth to the poor and prepared himself. After various torture sessions, including laceration on a wheel of swords in which he was

miraculously resuscitated three times, George was executed by decapitation before Nicomedia's city wall, on April 23, 303. A witness of his suffering convinced Empress Alexandra and Athanasius, a pagan priest, to become Christians as well, and so they joined George in martyrdom. His body was returned to Lydda for burial. where Christians soon came to honor him as a martvr.

Saint George and the Dragon

In the Western version, a dragon makes its nest at the spring that provides water for

the city of of "Silene" (perhaps modern Cyrene) in Libya or the city of Lydda, depending on the source. Consequently, the citizens have to dislodge the dragon from its nest for a time, in order to collect water. To do so, each day they offer the dragon at first a sheep, and if no sheep can be found, then a maiden must go instead of the sheep. The victim is chosen by drawing lots. One day, this happens to be the princess. The monarch begs for her life to be spared, but to no avail. She is offered to the dragon, but there appears Saint George on his travels. He faces the dragon, protects himself with the sign of the cross, slays it and rescues the paganism and convert to Christianity.

St George's Cross

The "Colours of Saint George", or St George's Cross are a white flag with a red cross, frequently borne by entities over which he is patron (e.g. England, Georgia, Liguria, Catalonia etc). The origin of the St George's Cross came from the earlier plain white tunics worn by the early crusaders.

Patronage and remembrance

With the revival of Scottish and Welsh nationalism, there has been renewed interest within England in Saint George, whose memory had been in abeyance for many years. This is most evident in the St George's flags which now have replaced Union Flags in stadiums where English sports teams compete. St George's Day is celebrated each vear in London with a day of celebration run by the Greater London Authority and the London Mayor. The City of Salisbury holds an annual St George's Day pageant, the origins of which are

believed to go back to the thirteenth century.

Spain

In Spain: San Jorge, in Catalunya: Sant Jordi, in Aragon: San Jorge).

In Spain, Saint George also came to be considered as the patron saint of the medieval Crown of Aragon and the territory of four current autonomous communities of Spain: Aragon, Catalonia, Valencia and the Balearic Islands. Nowadays Saint George is the patron saint of both Aragon and Catalonia, as well as the patron saint of historically important Spanish towns such as Cáceres or Alcoi.

Legend has it that Saint George, Patron Saint of Catalonia and international knight-errant, slew a dragon about to devour a beautiful Catalan princess. From the dragon's blood sprouted a rosebush, from which the hero plucked the prettiest rose for the princess. Hence the traditional Rose Festival celebrated in Barcelona since the Middle Ages to honor chivalry and love. At the end of the 19th century, Sant Jordi became a Catalan symbol as it was felt that his struggle against the dragon was similar to the Catalan struggle for freedom. In 1923, this lover's "fiesta" became even more poetic when it merged with "el dia del llibre", or The Day of the Book, to mark the nearly simultaneous deaths of Miguel de Cervantes and William Shakespeare, the two giants of literary history, on April 23, 1616. (the rose as a symbol of love and the book as a symbol of culture)

Anything that was once alive will break down into organic components. So if an item was comprised of 100% natural materials it can be composted, that's what nature would be doing anyway.



FE IN A CATALAN GARDEN

Garden prunings, lawn clippings and weeds - try

- Paper and cardboard just remove all plastic windows and any laminated products first.
- Kitchen scraps even meat and fish will compost down into lovely goodness for your soil. Just ensure your compost pile is pet proof and put these items deep into the pile. Bones can be a problem as they can become brittle and dangerous if swallowed by the dogs.
- Manure, 'humanure' & dog waste is controversial
 but hey what else will you do with it? Make sure it is
 always buried within the compost. If you have space
 for a dry composting toilet you can reduce your
 water usage and improve your compost creation
 in one step. Manure is full of bacteria that love
 to break down organic items. Commercial, organic
 compost activators are usually dry manure.
- Urine -probably best left to the boys!
- Wood ash and sawdust will add potash and bulk to your compost.
- Pet or livestock bedding from a gerbil cage
 or the contents of a hencoop
 - Other natural fibres old woollen sweaters, cotton socks, hair or pet fur.

Remember! Anything once alive will break down into compost.

Your finished compost will smell like rich woodland soil, crumbly and dark. But

before things are completely composted they can be a bit wiffy, so cover up or bury within the heap, all the smelly stuff!

Making compost is the most basic method of reducing waste and recycling.

Mother Nature's always done it and now so should we.

REFORMING A PROPERTY IN SPAIN: 7 COMMON MISTAKES TO AVOID rebuilding

or transforming a Catalan townhouse into a Spanish dream somehow property

owners don't always take into account that they may need to sell in the future.

As a real estate agent, I naturally get to see a wide range of reformed resale properties. Sadly, lack of attention to common sense basics at the planning stage can create obstacles to a sale a few years down the line.

This becomes acute when the supply of properties exceeds demand of course, so if you've bought an old house to renovate or are building new, be sure to think things through carefully before you hire an architect or start building-especially if you will be doing the work yourself.

1) How many bedrooms??

Spacious, exquisitely converted rural properties with just one or two huge bedrooms and price tags to match...

Ideal for a couple, they won't be an option for well-heeled families with children, looking for a holiday home.

Tip: try to include a small third or fourth bedroom, or an office/study that can easily be converted to one.

2) Keeping it on the level

A crucial point: buyers planning to retire in Spain are always alert to how stairs, steps and changes in level will affect them in the future. In particular, stairs in old village houses can be too steep to qualify for the cédula de habitabilidad certificate, needed in Catalonia for sale, rental, mortgage, and supply of mains services.

Tip: plan carefully to avoid or minimise changes in level, in and outside the house, and make sure all stairs are safe.

3) Use logical layouts

Older Spanish properties often feature strange labyrinths of tiny window-less rooms and endless corridors. While it

sounds obvious, it's worth taking extra care to achieve a logical layout of wellproportioned rooms.

Tip: if possible, avoid having a WC or bathroom connect directly on to a living room.



4) Natural light: get the right balance



While planning regulations mean enlarging or adding windows is not always possible in rural house reforms, natural light is a key appeal factor: no-one likes gloomy interiors. But

don't go over the top—Spanish windows are traditionally small to keep out the fierce summer heat.

Tip: do everything possible to create light interiors, and don't forget to use double-glazed windows and shutters.

5) Max headroom

For resale properties, the cédula requirements set a minimum ceiling height of 2.20 metres for bedrooms and living rooms, and 2.10 metres in kitchens, bathrooms and

Tip: watch headroom on stairways and above all, avoid low doorways: they are a major turn-off for most buyers.

6) Plan ahead for central heating

Anyone who's spent a winter in the campo will know that it can get pretty damn chilly at times! A single wood burner may work for you, but savvy buyers will be looking for central heating.

Tip: have pipes installed for central heating when you have your reform work done. That way, you -or a potential buyer— only need install radiators and a boiler at a later

7) Avoid the patchwork floor effect!

Use the same type of flooring throughout a home to achieve a seamless effect. Integrating small areas of old or decorative tiles into the mix can work very well, but needs to be done skilfully. Avoid different tiles in every room! It

looks bitty, and buyers will factor the replacement cost into

Tip: use flooring in keeping with the type of property. Shiny ceramic tiles look fine in modern interiors, less so in a reformed *masia*. Good quality terracotta-type tiles always seem popular with buyers.

WHENCE PROCEEDS THE CUSTOM OF MAKING APRIL FOOLS?"

In 1708 a correspondent wrote in to the British Apollo magazine to ask, "Whence proceeds the custom of making April Fools?" The question is one that many people are still asking today.

In the April 2nd, 1698 edition of Dawks's News-Letter (a British newspaper) reported

that "Yesterday being the first of April, several persons were sent to the Tower Ditch to see the Lions washed." Sending gullible victims to the Tower of London to see the "washing of the lions" (a non-existent ceremony) was a popular prank.

It became traditional for this prank to be played on April Fool's Day.

The most widespread theory about the origin of April Fool's Day involves the Gregorian calendar reform of the late sixteenth century.

The theory goes like this: In 1582 France became the first country to switch from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar established by the Council of Trent (1563). This switch meant, among other things, that the beginning of the year was moved from the end of March to January 1. Those who failed to keep up with the change, who stubbornly clung to the old calendar system and continued to celebrate the New Year during the week that fell between

The date of Passover is variable as it is dependent on the phases of the moon, and thus Easter is also a movable feast.




Four mathematicians who do not know each other are invited by a mysterious host on the pretext of resolving a great enigma. The room in which they find themselves turns out to be a shrinking room that will crush them if they do not discover in time what connects them all and why someone might wish to murder them. That's the starting point of this gripping suspenseful Spanish film filmed in Barcelona.

By fusing several elements, the director brings it all back home: the enigmas are borrowed from the "saw" saga (but without any of the pointless gore and with special effects kept to the minimum); the place reminds me of another Indy classic "Cube" ; there are also elements taken from Agatha Christie's classic "Ten little Indians" aka "And then there were none" (guests are invited to a remote house, where the host is to kill us but actually he is one of us; and of course they have all done something wrong before).

Mathematics of course comes centre place to the essence of the film. Some of them are classics, as the young math genius points out: the three children and the story of the shepherd, the wolf, the sheep and the cabbage. All the actors are excellent, and the fact that Lluis Hornar resembles just a little the late great Laurence Olivier cannot help make you think of "sleuth".

The ending is borrowed from "Le Theoreme du Perroquet" (by Daniel Guedj) another book which blends a detective story and the history of maths. In that book, they tried to prove a theorem which Andrew Wiles, an English mathematician finally proved in 1993.....that in conclusion was Fermat's *conjecture*.





FRUIT TREES FLOURISH IN SPAIN IF!!

Spain is a fantastic place to grow your own fruit. The climate allows one to consider growing a wide range of fruit and it is possible by careful selection to harvest one or more fruits on every day of

the year — even from apartment terraces. Indeed some of the easiest fruits to grow can be grown in various types of containers. For instance strawberries in a strawberry barrel or window box, a grape vine in a tub trailing along a balustrade or supported on an end wall and a perpetual flowering/fruiting Lunar lemon and early season white fleshed peach tree in large pots. With the latter not only do you get the benefit of picking perfectly ripe tasty juicy peaches for immediate eating but also the early blossom. Our tree in a tub started to flower in the middle of January while the almond blossom in the garden below was still out and the blossom has survived the recent gales.

With a garden one can obviously expand and plant fruit trees in containers on terraces, trained on walls or as spring flowering/summer or autumn fruiting trees anywhere in the flower beds. Naturally if you have a large property one can develop a dedicated orchard.

So much is possible but there are a number of important success factors each covered in detail in our book.

Firstly do plant fruits that you like. Over seventy are described in the book including tropical/subtropical fruits

for the frost free coastal plain and temperate types that need inland frosts to fruit well. The former include citrus fruits, mangoes and avocados and the latter cherry and pear trees.

Secondly chose strong

plants and if oranges or mandarins check out when they will be ready to harvest. In both cases there are early, mid season and late season varieties to chose from — some ripening in October and others as late as early June. We list some of the most popular varieties in the book.

Thirdly prepare the ground and planting holes in advance and ensure that the young root ball is spread out when planting. If not, strangled roots can develop that result in stunted poorly fruiting trees.

Fourthly spray with ecological insecticides and fungicides to ensure that the garden is save even when spraying for the family, pets and wildlife. Luckily such products can be made up at home or purchased from gardening shops and agricultural cooperatives. Look out for the Seipasa and Trabe brands.

Spring has finally sprung and we're turning our thoughts to spring cleaning our homes, and perhaps our bodies. The benefits of yoga such as weight loss and toned muscles are available to us all.

There are however three keys to enjoying yoga's undisputed benefits. They are 100% under your control, and affect not only your enjoyment of your practice, but just as importantly, the benefits you receive from each practice.

1. Challenge yourself

One of the purposes of yoga, like every exercise regime, is to incrementally improve your body's physical capabilities. Yoga of course has the added advantage that it also helps to improve many aspects of your health and well-being that general exercise cannot.

Even with these increased benefits, yoga is not a magic cureall. Achieving these benefits requires your commitment and effort each time you practice. Achieving incremental improvements to your capabilities requires (and allows) you to further challenge your own physical limitations. Over time improvements result in large gains in your yoga abilities and the health and weight loss benefits of your practice.

In every posture you should be looking to make sure first that you are stable and comfortable in the posture. You should then be aiming to slowly and smoothly deepen the stretch as far as it remains pain free for you to do so. In all postures you should feel the stretch in the relevant muscles and deepen into the stretch in a controlled manner to avoid damaging your muscles and ligaments. You should challenge your own abilities in order to achieve new yoga abilities, but also listen carefully to your body to know when to stop.

2. Breathing

There is a lot of discussion and research into the importance and health benefits of yoga breathing. While these may well prove to be real benefits, adopting relaxed, controlled yoga breathing definitely helps to improve your overall yoga practice.

The natural tendency, when practicing an asana (yoga posture) that tests your physical abilities, is to shorten

your breath and in some cases, to start breathing through your mouth. This stressful breathing technique encourages you to tense your muscles and fight against the asana and the stretch. This is the opposite of the desired state for practicing yoga.

Instead it's important that you concentrate on your breathing, completing a long, controlled inhale exhale cycle that fills your lungs to capture the maximum amount of oxygen for each breath. Focusing on your breathing in this way, helps you to remain relaxed and allows you to be more aware of your physical condition enabling you to better feel the stretch, be aware of tension in your muscles and concentrate on releasing that tension and to loosen the muscles you're working on. Through this increased awareness of what you body is telling you and by noticing and releasing tension in your muscles, it's easier to accept each stretch and go deeper into each asana and hold it for longer without injury.

3. Practice, Practice, Practice.

As with all exercise, the benefits only come with a commitment to regular practice. Only through regular practice of exercise does the body start to develop, strengthen, adapt and change according to the physical demands you are placing on it. Practicing yoga is no different. Regular practice helps to build the muscle strength required to hold asanas. More than that, you'll develop increased lung capacity and provide the regular stimulation to the internal organs that helps balance chemical and hormone levels. Frequent practice helps to learn any new skill or ability and yoga is no different. In particular, repetition helps your body learn the correct position balancing postures, to the extent that it becomes second nature - just like riding a bike. Another area where frequent practice is highly beneficial is learning how to slow and calm your mind, to purge your thoughts of the worries and stresses of the day. This increased serenity, along with welcome weight loss benefits, can be taken 'off the mat' and into the rest of your life.



WINDOWS XP INTERFACE TIPS...

elcome to this months computer guide. In these articles I will be giving some advice on how to make windows behave in the way you would prefer. This makes using your PC more enjoyable and efficient. These tips are for Windows XP, and although some of them are relevant, I will provide specific advice for Windows Vista in the future. Continued from last month:

6. Show Control Panel as a Menu

For quicker access to the Windows XP control panel's assortment of applications, you can set the control panel to appear as a submenu in the start menu, similar to the existing 'accessories' submenu.

To do this Right click on the 'start' button and choose 'properties.' Select the 'customize' button to the right of the 'start menu' option. Choose the 'advanced' tab and then in the 'start menu items' box, find 'control panel' and select the 'display as menu' option.

7. Associate and Un-Associate Applications from certain file types. File associations are what tells Windows XP which applications should open which type of files. Every file type has or will acquire a default program to open it (as long as one is available on the machine) and will then use this program every time. Since many programs will change these file associations when they are installed (to make themselves the default software), it's quite possible to end up with an application you do not want opening your pictures or documents.

To change this, you will need to open an explorer





window such as 'my computer' then go to 'tools\folder options.' From the folder options, select the 'file types' tab, and wait while Windows builds the list of file types present on your PC

Scroll through the 'registered file types' box until you find the file extension of the file type you wish to change; JPEG, JPG or JPE for JPEG graphic files, for example. Highlight it and hit the 'change' button below to select a new application to open this file type by default.

As an alternative, you can also right click any file; go to 'properties.' And click the 'change' button to choose your application. Scroll through the 'registered file types' box until you find the file extension of the file type you wish to change; JPEG, JPG or JPE for JPEG graphic files, for example. Highlight it and hit the 'change' button below to select a new application to open this file type by default.

As an alternative, you can also right click any file; go to 'properties.' And click the 'change' button to choose your application.
