



#### NEWS IN SPAIN

our Weeks Paternity Leave Following the approval of a measure by the Commission of Equality this week, Spanish men will be entitled to four weeks maternity leave from 2011. This is an increase from the 15 days allowed by the law of 2007, which was to rise progressively to four weeks by 2013.

arifa fire stabilised after destroying 290 hectares 700 tourists evacuated from a nearby hotel were allowed back late on Saturday 18th July. The forest fire affecting the Sierra de la Plata near Tarifa was said to be stable at midday on Sunday after blazing for more than 24 hours and destroying 290 hectares of land. The emergency alert was brought down to Level 0, with no more danger of the flames affecting inhabited areas. The 700 people evacuated from the Hotel Meliá Atlanterra and the Jardines de Atlanterra urbanisation were allowed back late on Saturday after they were evacuated to a local school earlier that day. Saturday's fire-fighting effort was hampered by winds of up to 80 kms an hour and winds in the area were still reaching speeds of up to 45 kms an hour on Sunday. The Junta de Andalucía's environment department however told El Mundo newspaper there was no further risk




Meanwhile there was also a large fire in Agramunt, Lleida on Friday 17th July. It was brought under control by fire crews on Saturday, but not before it had affected 5,100 hectares, 27% of which was forestry land. One person died as a result of the fire which is believed to



have been started by a falling electricity cable. And one thousand hectares were destroyed by another fire in Léon, which was reported to be under control on Sunday 19th July.

He's seen being given a lesson in Spanish humour by the Málaga comedian, Chiquito de la Calzada. Unfortunately, neither appears in the film itself.



he Government cancels the excess use power surcharge The Ministry for Industry has announced it is to eliminate the controversial charge for excess use of electricity. The Spanish Federation of Numerous Families is among those to welcome the decision, considering that the excess charge which was being levied on a per-property basis took no account on whether the property was occupied by a large family or a single person. The charge had been introduced in July last year. Meanwhile in a separate decision users who suffered an extended power cut in Barcelona in 2007 have been told they can apply for compensation. A judge has fixed payments between 122 and 300 €.

€100 for light offences, €200 for mid level, and €500 for very serious ones. Discounts for prompt payment will go up from 30% to 50%.

# NEWS HOUNDS & MORE.. BY DR. RONALD ROSENFELD D.V.M. THE SUMMER WARS When we bathe in the ocean

t is summertime again, time for those enjoyable outings to hike in the hills or bathe at the beach: beware though. all that glitters may not be gold! While enjoying this warmest time of the year be wary as the time is also wonderful for fleas, ticks, mosquitoes, and biting flies, to name a few ectoparasites, whose life cycles are also in full bloom these days and will continue to do so until the autumn.

These pests not only bother our pets but may also pester us at times as well. If you have not yet instituted flea and tick control it is time to revise and re-evaluate the products that have worked for you in the past, hoping that the fleas did not develop resistance this year to last years products, which with regard to some of the commercial preparations is all to frequent a phenomenon. If this has occurred then the best solution is to find a couple of different products and alternate their use to stay ahead of the defence mechanisms of these interlopers. Remember that it is important to control the environment first and your animals second, otherwise you may find the war lost prior to the first shot being fired.





I'M BACK: I'M BACK: IT'S GOOD TO BE BACK. This month's tip has to do with

horse's feet, (Hooves) to be precise. Many people think that the hoof is quite a way down the general make up of the horse, because it is so strong. Well you are right, it is strong, but problems can occur, for example: - the two bottom hinge joints, pivot like a hinge. Ligaments hold them in place; the joint has rounded edges, so it is easy to move within the joint. The upper hinge joint holding it in place. This upper hinge joint has a small ridge of bone preventing sideways motion, & stops it being dislodged. This is why people bandage them so that there is less damage to these two joints. Although the hoof itself is strong, the two joints above are very fragile.



In this hot climate, Linseed Oil is a very good idea. Apply this once a month. To help lubricate the joints. Put some on an old rag & apply well around the hoof, not forgetting the frog, underneath the hoof. Keep this rag which can be used time & time again.

(Don't let your partner use this rag for checking the oil in the car.) Branches of the suspensory ligaments hold the fetlock pastern & coffin joints in position. So you can see it is a complex joint, although it can withstand some hard knocks.

If you are jumping your horse, to a high standard, it is good practise to bandage these joints. Remember, they can be easily pushed out of their sockets, or fractured, with a fall,

When you have finished working your horse, rub Olive Oil in these joints. It helps to keep them supple. Horses can get a form of arthritis in these joints so the oil is good for this as well.

Good practice is also to, once a week, apply Olive Oil with a small brush, on the hoof, top & bottom, especially around the frog of the hoof. This can get very dry & hard, due to this hot climate.





The town gets decked out in its finest in August to celebrate the feast days of its patron saints; St. Bartholomew and the saints Senén and Abdón and Santa María del Mar. The variety of events covers everything from concerts, dances, children's shows, entertainment with bulls and young bulls, and correfocs, and even sports events such as trap-shooting, pigeon racing, to petanca. Music and the noise of fireworks feature widely.

The origin of the celebrations date back to 1523, when Emperor Charles I awarded Benicarló «...the privilege of a fair for Saint Bartholomew», in addition to awarding it the title of Town.

The celebrations held in honour of its patron saints fill Benicarló with light and colour, and a large proportion of the population takes part. The constant activity and variety of acts make the celebrations attractive for people of all ages.

The celebrations begin with the «Cridá», which includes concerts, exhibitions, painting events, firework displays, «mascletaes», and the typical «Bous a la Mar» (bulls on the sea shore), where the sea acts as a refreshing refuge from the bull, although sometimes it is not enough as the bull also ends up plunging into the water.

The nightlife takes on another dimension as the usual range of entertainment is extended to include the noisy «casals» (premises) of the «penyas», or groups of friends who meet to celebrate the festival more intensely.



With falling prices, an improving exchange rate and good buys to be had, right now is a great time to buy.

So how do you get started? Read on: buying a property here is actually much simpler than you might expect.

#### Two things you must have

1) An account with a Spanish bank.

Opening a 'cuenta corrient' —a current account— in Spain is quite simple: you just need your passport. Choose a bank with English speaking staff that can help you with finance, services and money transfers, and make sure it provides easy

to-use Internet banking in English, so you can easily keep track of your account.

#### 2) An NIE number - the foreigners' fiscal ID number

Non-Spanish buyers must have an NIE number in order to buy a property in Spain, and a non-Spaniard selling a Spanish property needs one too.

For EU citizens, getting an NIE number is easy and the only charge is a small tax — less than 10 euros. See our buyers' guide at http://www.fincasdirect.com/en/buying-in-spain. html for more info.

#### Finding a property

There are lots of factors to take into account of course, but most importantly (particularly with country properties):

- Is the building legal and registered?
- Will I get planning permission to extend, reform or rebuild?
- Will I be able to resell later if I need to? We have good local contacts with town

halls and planning departments, and can help you choose the right property and avoid problems later on.

#### Carrying out a survey

Structural surveys are not automatically carried out here as part of the purchase process. Unlike developers of new properties that must have insurance to cover possible problems, sellers of resale properties are not necessarily liable for structural defects.

Surveyors can also advise you about planning issues and the scope and price of any work needed.

#### Negotiating the price

Most sellers are now prepared to consider sensible offers, with very few holding out for the full asking price, so feel free to haggle!

At this stage you need to know the costs and expenses involved, which come to roughly 10% of the purchase price (more if you take out a mortgage), and are:

- Notary's fees
- VAT and Stamp Duty
- Land Registry Fees

#### Securing the property: the deposit contract

While you can go straight to completion, once a price is agreed it's usual to sign a private contract with the seller the contrato de arras. This details:



Property to be sold Purchase price Completion date (usually

- or 3 months from signing the contract)
- Deposit paid (usually

- Any special conditions

The 10% deposit is not refundable if the buyer pulls out. But if the seller pulls out or fails to meet the contract conditions, he or she must refund the buyer double the deposit paid.

This arrangement protects both parties, affords peace of mind, and greatly reduces any risk of 'gazumping'.

#### Completion: signing the Escritura

The sale is carried out by a state-approved *Notario* —a Notary Public— who prepares the Escritura Pública de Compraventa —the Deed of Transfer— in accordance with Spanish Law.

Before the sale, the Notary checks that the property is registered in the seller's name, and knows if there are mortgages or other charges that must be cleared.

The Notary acts in the interests of the State, and doesn't represent the buyer or the seller. But Spanish notaries are generally very helpful, and can provide detailed information and advice. Some speak English.

#### Registering the Deed of Transfer and paying expenses

After the sale the buyer has to pay taxes.

Most notaries can do the tax payment and registration process for you. If you are using an independent lawyer, he or she will often handle it. Either way, you will be asked to make a payment to cover estimated costs.

The Transfer Deed is then recorded in the Land Registry and the property put in the new owner's name. This usually takes around six weeks.

2-3 months later the formal Escritura document will be ready for you to collect.

# FESTA DE SANT MAGI TARRAGONA AUGUST 2009

#### Sant Magí (15-19 August)

The feast day of the city's minor patron saint is marked by four or five days filled with a lively waterfront parade known as the Seguici Popular (literally, "Popular Retinue"), human castles and music for all tastes and ages.

Sant Magi\* himself was probably a III or IV Century hermit who lived in the Sierra de Brufaganya, his hermitage is hidden among cliffs overlooking a delightful secret valley near the headwaters of the Riu Gaià. After the dramatic ravines encountered downstream the landscape beyond the Sierra de Brufaganya opens out to reveal the rolling hill country that separates the Segre basin from the plains of Tarragona. Life must have been hard indeed for the likes of Sant Magi. Nothing is known in detail about his exploits but it appears that from the early XII Century a cult grew up around his tomb, resulting in the establishment of a monastery or 'Sanctuary' alongside. Magi appeared in papal lists of saints in the XVI Century with over 300 miracles accredited to him. By the early XVIII Century the number of pilgrims was such that extra wells had to be dug to cope with the demand for healing waters and it was during alterations to the crypt in 1735 that his remains were found to be uncorrupted and have the 'odour of sanctity'.

The link with Tarragona dates from 1588, when the city's bishop made a pilgrimage to mark the departure of the Spanish Armada. Catalan King Jaume I, the Conqueror, launched his invasion fleet, said to consist of over 500 vessels, from this coast in 1229 and,...

"We set sail on Wednesday morning with the land wind behind us . . . and when the men of Tarragona and Cambrils saw the fleet getting under way from Salou, they too made sail, and it was a fine thing for both those on land and for us to watch, for all the sea seemed white with sails, so areat was our fleet."

Pilgrimages to the Sanctuary are also recorded from other towns and villages, and that of nearby Santa Coloma de Queralt is known to have been continuous from those days. A feature is that water from the spring at Brufaganya is carried back. This water is noted for curative powers, most notably for venereal diseases, so it's always handy to keep a bottle or two available.

Nowadays the route of the aigüa miraculosa, or miracle water, is followed by a caravan of horses and carts, which carry the water over 2 days. As one of Tarragona's two Festes Majors, the celebrations start well before this, but when the cavalcade finally arrives in the early evening of August the 18th the party really begins. One notable feature is that the drovers and crew of the carts bring huge amounts of basil, so as to disperse the fleas, flies and other beasties that they might have picked up in the countryside, and to scent the city with its sweet smell. The water is received in the Plaza de la Fuente, with sincerity and celebration. Then the procession of the Holy Magí tours the mediaeval city centre. When the water has reached the streets of Las Tortas and the Arch of St. Lawrence, it is greeted by groups of human towers, giants and bands. and the celebrations really begin.

"This water, reminds us of traditional values and miraculous healing."

#### CHALLENGES OF GARDENING IN CATALUNYA COUNTRYFY YOUR **COUNTRY** GARDEN by Clodagh and Dick Handscombe, now enjoying their twenty

s the temperatures rise we often hear people saying things like: 'Oh isn't it hot after the air conditioning. I've been indoors for three days without going out'

'We don't sit out much in the summer it's boring. There is not much to see except the pool and it's large terrace and the wooden decking is so hot to walk on'.

' Oh I wish we hadn't cut down those trees and replaced them with Australian sails – the shade is not as natural or as deep as it used to be swinging in the hammock between two thick branches of the carob tree'.

'I spend all my time watering the plants but the garden is not as colourful as it was in Britain'.

'Oh I can't stand another barbecued dinner and it's only June'

Luckily there are answers to all such comments to ensure that you achieve what you came to Spain for – a more outdoor life 1 than in northern Europe.

Firstly getting used to the Spanish climate needs gradual acclimatisation. Go out into the sun early in the day and go into the shade when it gets too hot and then go back into the sun in the early evening and turn the air conditioning off or set it at a higher temperature. We don't have it but we keep the house cool in the summer by closing

the windows and keeping the persianas down and on the hottest days the wooden shutters shut.

Any urban looking pool can be converted into a natural pool surrounding by oxygenating bog plants and some of the flowers are exotic. An interesting book 'Converting your conventional pool' can be obtained via www.ecodesignscape.co.uk.

If you plan a long stay in Spain plant some more trees this autumn. There are plenty to chose from in Part Four of our book Your Garden in Spain'. This section also ists hundreds of flowering plants and most importantly indicating their drought resistances. These are the plants that require little or no watering once they are established. Plant more of these to reduce watering needs.

There are many interesting types of natural rocks old bricks and terracotta tiles that look more natural than timber cladding. See chapter 2.4 of 'Your garden in Spain'.

If you want more interesting foods than barbecued consider a Mexican oven. Moroccan tagines or a solar cooker. The latter are becoming very popular and the Andalucian Government is currently offering grants to stimulate their use...do you have a friend living down there? Even without the twenty percent grant they are not expensive and don't use electricity gas or charcoal.

Sangria is the most famous Spanish drink made with red wine, fruit juice, sparkling soft drinks, sugar and fruit chunks. Sometimes liqueurs are added, as well as cinnamon. It is hard to find two sangrias that taste the same, since there is no one-single recipe for it. For sangria to be good, it is necessary to use good wine (bad wine makes bad sangria), to serve it fresh, and to achieve a fruity flavour that is not overdone (the best fruits for it are citruses and peach). It is important to remember that sangria is an alcoholic beverage, and although is very easy on the palate, it should be drank moderately.

#### Sangria 1

1 bottle dry full-bodied red wine 1 can fizzy orange, chilled 1 can fizzy lemon, chilled Spanish brandy - or any which is quite light Banana liqueur

A

Cointreau 1 apple, chopped 1 pear, chopped

1 lemon, thinly sliced

1 orange, thinly sliced

1 teaspoon sugar

1 cinnamon stick Ice cubes

Put all the fruit pieces into a large jug, then pour over a generous amount of the banana liqueur, cointreau and brandy. Pour in the bottle of wine, and leave in the fridge to chill. Once this is really cold, pour in the fizzy drinks and add the cinnamon and sugar. Mix in some ice cubes and it's ready to serve.



#### Sangria 2

1 bottle red wine (Burgundy preferred) 1 can frozen pink lemonade concentrate, do not add water 1 lemon, sliced; 1 lime, sliced

> 1 orange, sliced 1/2 cup bing cherries (if available) 1/2 cup brandy

4 cups carbonated lemon-lime beverage (7 Up or Sprite)

Mix wine, lemonade concentrate and brandy together in large glass pitcher. Squeeze juice from each slice of fruit into wine mixture before dropping fruit in. Toss in cherries and chill. Just before serving, add 7up. Pour into chilled glasses and enjoy. Don't forget to eat the fruit- especially the cherries- yum.

#### Sangria 3

2 bottles full bodied Spanish dry red wine 1/3 cup fresh squeezed orange juice 1/4 cup Grand Marnier (or any orangeflavoured liquor)

2 tablespoons sugar

2 cups club soda

Ice cube

To garnish:

orange slice; lemon slices tart green apple, sliced

peaches or nectarines, sliced

In a large pitcher, mix together the first 4 ingredients. Cover and refrigerate for several hours or overnight. Just before serving, add the club soda and plenty of ice cubes. Serve very cold garnished with a slice of fruit. Note: if using a punch bowl, float the various fruit



THE number of cases of swine flu could catch up with the number of cases of hiccups and diarrhoea, given 10-12 years, doctors have claimed.



#### **HEALTH SELF-HELP TOOLKIT:** UNDERSTANDING LOWER BACK PAIN & SCIATICA

For most of us, understanding what is going on helps us cope when dealing with pain, whether by helping us deal with uncertainty or by finding pointers as to how to take better care of ourself. Over half of the Western

population has to deal with back pain at one point or another, so some understanding as to what goes on in this often mystifying Spinal and vital part of our body can Vertebra be useful.

Spinal cord Sometimes lower back pain seems to arise from nowhere; at other times it's clearly related to a fall, accident, over-lifting or digging, for example. Back pain can be caused by many conditions, the most common of which are the following four:

Disk

HERNIATED

(1) LIGAMENT strain - a general term applied when there is no other clear problem seen for chronic recurrent lower back pain, where the back muscles are weak or overworked and fail to protect the ligaments (which attach to bone) so they get overstrained. This type of back pain is usually better with rest & worse with exercise. From the traditional Chinese medicine view (TCM) boosting the Liver & Spleen to help ligaments and muscles respectively helps, alongside treating the back itself.

(2) Problems of the JOINTS where vertebrae meet (spondylosis)- Here a disease (usually ankylosis) causes hardening, or ossification, of the joints between vertebra. Movement over the troubled joint(s) is restricted and causes pain, and the muscles along the spine are stiff and spasm. In TCM, boosting the Liver to support ligaments and cartilage helps this condition along with treating localised pain points with massage or acupuncture.


(3) Problems with the SPINE's BONES/VERTEBRAE themselves (spinal osteoarthritis)- Osteoarthritis mainly affects the cartilage (protective tissue at the end of bones) which becomes worn away so that there is no cushioning between bone surfaces, &/or little bony spurs develop like bird-beaks which can put pressure on nerves travelling away from the spinal cord, causing pain in the back & sometimes the areas the nerves relate to as well. In TCM helping the Kidneys strengthens the bones plus there are special points to boost the bones themselves bordering the spine which you can massage or treat with acupuncture. We can also see if there is Cold or Damp to clear, which can accumulate

causing lower back Cervical pain, or general Kidney weakness. (4)Prolapse of the lumbar DISC- The discs are cartilage pads between 2 vertebrae which allow the spinal column to move when the pad

is a sac of fluid-er matter

which can burst through

(prolapse) the cartilage ring



holding it in if the cartilage is weak or over-pressured. This condition is often referred to as a slipped disc, but actually the disc doesn't move, just the sac inside bulges out. As the disc's outer ring hardens with age, prolapse/bulge becomes less easy & this mostly happens to people in their 30s/early 40s. The bulge can interfere with the nerve roots leaving the spinal column as above in (3), and will often come on as a sudden shooting pain in the back, often down the leg (sciatica), and sometimes numbness.

Lateral

Osreophyle

A person with a disc prolapse pressing on a nerve root will find it hard to lift one straight leg up when lying down, when flexing from the hip; the pain on trying to do so is on the side where the nerve root is compressed. When acute it can be hard to get any comfortable position at all. However the outer ring of the disc can heal and the torn (herniated) inner sac can be reabsorbed; complete bed-rest is needed to allow this to happen. With TCM we boost the Liver to support cartilage in order to speed up healing of the disc, along with local back points to reduce pain, compression

Back pain responds well to acupuncture, and unlike many other conditions treatment is less related to the length of time the problem has been there, and cases of very chronic backache can sometimes be cleared in a few sessions. Treating and relaxing muscles & ligaments allows the spine to realign itself properly. Lack of regular exercise is one of the main causes of back pain, so even regular walking is a good way of preventing back pain from re-occurring, along with gentle stretching and twisting exercise. Caution lifting weights is essential if you are prone to back strain – easier said than done, if you're living in the campo!
