ossible 1.200€ fine for leaving dogs in car. Valencia City Council has initiated proceedings against a woman for leaving two dogs inside a locked car, with neither water nor ventilation and is suggesting a fine of 1,200€. The offence took place at the beginning of last year in Valencia's Calle Lérida but the case is only being tried now. Council officials consider that the woman has committed a 'serious contravention' of the authonomous Pet Protection laws passed in 1994 by leaving the animals in 'inadequate accommodation' and 'without the ncecessary care and attention'. Serious contraventions of this law can lead to fines of between 601.01€ and 6.010.11€

roposal to Create Artificial Reefs Ayuntamiento of Nerja and two groups of diving enthusiasts have proposed the sinking of wooden boats and cement blocks to create artificial reefs in the sea 200 m off its beaches. The idea is designed to encourage the diversity of the marine

depths and to discourage dragnet fishing on the sea bed in the area. The plan has to go before the Junta de Andalucía for approval before the project can be undertaken.



pain Spends More on Stimulating Property Market A bank report has noted that the Spanish government is spending 2% of GDP on stimulating the property market, compared with 0.3% in France, Italy and UK. Over 52,000 residential mortgages were signed in March, 1% up on February and slightly up on January. The average mortgage was 119,067, a 16% decrease on February figures. There are suggestions in the Spanish press that the property recession may be bottoming out.

riend of the Environment David Attenborough has been given the prestigious Premio Príncipe de Asturias de Ciencias Sociales 2009 award for his outstanding contribution to conservation and defence of the life of the planet. The decision of the adjudicating panel as to the recipient was "practically unanimous" according to the Spanish spokesman for the foundation.

ree Market for Electricity Starts Next Month On the first of July the electricity market is to be deregulated in Spain, so consumers have a month to choose their supplier and sign up to a contract. There are around twenty suppliers to select from, but those that decide not to exercise their right of choice by that date will automatically revert to the default option, called la Tarifa de Último Recurso, (TUR), administered by Endesa Energía XXI and regulated by the government. The suppliers are generally in agreement that there will not be much opportunity for competitive pricing in the domestic market, since there is to be a basic, centrally regulated tariff for all homes; their main areas for competition will be among the large consumers.

He added: "And of course, with an upper limit of £1,250 a month in mortgage interest payments, they will still be able to buy a house worth at least £300,000 using your money. Ha ha ha - what a bunch of absolute gits."



disease causing agents. Many of the treatments for these problems may include medicated baths, one should never use human shampoos on animals as their skin pH (acidity level) is quite different to ours! Skin diseases often require patience in achieving a cure.

energy has been drained from you. So how do you meet the demands of your day when your body and mind feel lethargic due to excessive temperatures? Take some time to try a few yoga techniques. These postures require very little energy to perform, but will have the effect of cooling and re-energising your body, and calming your mind. Legs up the wall pose (Viparita Karani)



floor with your buttocks as close to the wall as comfortable, raised slightly. your legs up and resting firmly against the wall. Your arms should be relaxed by your side, with palms facing upwards. Adjust

yourself so that you have no discomfort in this position. Let your eyes be closed and relaxed. A beautiful variation is to cover your eyes with a herb scented eye pillow.

Stay in this position for 5-15 minutes, breathing deeply and slowly from your diaphragm. Mentally scan each part of your body, releasing any tension in those areas with each exhalation. Let your mind become tranquil as your body restores itself in this deep stillness.

When coming out of the posture, slowly lower your legs by bending your knees and bringing them close to your chest. Gently roll onto your right side, and when you feel ready, slowly resume a sitting position.

This posture allows the blood and other bodily fluids to flow more easily from the legs back to the heart and vital organs, flooding them with nutrients. The anti-gravity effect means the heart doesn't have to pump as hard, thereby slowing the heart rate and cooling and re-energising the body.

After emerging from this restorative pose, you should feel calmer, more balanced, and less fatigued. It is a wonderful pose for those suffering from tired, aching legs, and can also be used to combat travel fatigue.

Extended Childs pose (Balasana)

Excessively hot days often patience



as your energy. The following posture has a very calming effect on the mind, as well as releasing pressure on the spine and rejuvenating the entire body. on the floor with your toes together, knees spine and bend forward from your hips on exhalation, arms outstretched in front and forehead resting firmly on the floor. Your knees should be as wide apart as comfortable. -Breathe fully and slowly, and with each exhalation, feel your body melt into the floor. Hold for 5-10 breathes, and then very slowly resume an upright position. This is a beautiful posture for delivering a freshly oxygenated supply of blood to the brain, thus enabling it to function more clearly and efficiently. **Extended Childs Pose**

Pranayama

Prana is the Sanskrit name for life-force/breath, and correct breathing is an important part of yoga. Practicing pranayamic

exercises increases lung capacity, thereby enabling more oxygen to be pumped throughout the body and to the brain. Shitali breathing

Shitali means cooling, and is a particularly good pranayamic practice to cool you down in summer. -Curl the sides of your tongue into a tube and breathe in air over your outstretched tongue. As the air travels over the wet tongue it is cooled down. Close your mouth and hold the cool air in your lungs for a second or two before gently releasing it, breathing out through your nose. This works much the same way as a dog that pants to regulate his body temperature. Repeat the process 5-10 times, but do not practice more than 10 rounds of this breathing.



ities can be born a thousand and one times; reconstructed from their ashes or reinvented through imagination. The reborn Benicassim that we know today owes as much to its sun, surf and sand as it does to Oasis and Leonard Cohen; as much to its peculiar mountain range, polka-dotted with caves, crags and cliffs, as to the magic of Björk and the howling of Jon Spencer; as much to the Las Palmas desert as to the Festival's concert venue. Today's Benicassim is synonymous with FIB Heineken.

Benicassim – a name of Arab origins, "sons of Qasim" – has had an action-packed history due to its location on the Mediterranean: once a refuge for pirates and smugglers, and now, ever since 1995, a second home and truly magical city by the sea for a week of each summer thanks to FIB Heineken. Situated in the very heart of the Costa del Azahar, Benicassim boasts everything a modern vacation spot needs to make its visitors feel comfortable so they can thoroughly enjoy the scenery, the weather, the cuisine, the beach, the sports facilities and, of course, the music. A city reborn on the Mediterranean coast, proud of its present, which has redefined its geographic

coordinates. Since it began in 1995 Benicassim has secured itself a place as one of Europe's premier festivals. The festival frequently provides a line-up that is among the best in Europe with a selection of stellar artists and superstar DJs. Across the event's five stages the likes of Sigur Ros, Gnarls Barkley, Leonard Cohen and Justice all performed last year, so, as per usual, expect a similar calibre of artists this time around.

Since it began in 1995 Benicassim has secured itself a place as one of Europe's premier festivals. Each year revellers from around the world descend on the Costa del Azahar to experience four days of music, art, theatre, dance, fashion and short films.

Organisers allow festival-goers to stay in the free campsite for up to nine days (three days before and two days after the festival) and enjoy the local beach and usually scorching sunshine. As Spanish times apply, an apartment is recommended as the music doesn't start until evening and continues through the night, which means the sun rises as you fall!



15 Years of History

In 1994, post-Madrilenian Groove Madrid was in hectic full swing and shedding itself, specifically, of some of the less convenient burdens of those happy years. Bustling, noisy, cosmopolitan and, above all, fun, the capital was starting to build on one of the basic pillars of the new youth movement (the members of which seemed innocent and harmless enough, but they could sure roar up a storm): Music, pure and simple, and no pretensions.

Between concerts, Luis Calvo and Joako Ezpeleta, both editors at the magazine Spiral (Calvo was also head of Elefant Records), joined up with Miguel and José Morán, who were running Maravillas, to really bring about what had until then only seemed like a pipe dream: "We would dream of creating the perfect space for an international gathering of young music lovers; a place full of unique, enriching and unforgettable experiences where people could share their interests and passion for music and life while providing an emotionally-charged base of support for cutting-edge bands to put on really amazing and oneof-a-kind shows." And, the opportunity arrived when they found the ideal spot on the Mediterranean for truly great summer holidays - a friendly place, lots of sun, surf and sand, and beautiful weather. Francesc Colomer, who was then the mayor of the small city of Benicassim, listened to their proposal and recognised the incredible possibilities of such a venture. He took a gamble and ultimately won. The first edition of the International Benicassim Festival was underway.

In 1998, the Festival expanded significantly and considerably when it moved to a new venue, offering far better conditions for both the fans and the artists – Björk, Sonic Youth, PJ Harvey, Primal Scream, Spiritualized and sixty other bands performing on three stages over three days, kicking off a new stage in the Festival's life with style. It was also in 1998 that the Festival's Extramusical Activities were launched, such as the FIB Fashion Show and the FIB-Act theatre festival, both of which are non-profit ventures. FESTIVAL VERGE DEL CARME/VIRGEN DEL CARMEN 16TH JULY 2009 IN L'AMPOLLA & MANY OTHER COASTAL TOWNS

L'Ampolla 15-18 July Festival Verge del Carme 2009 plus on the 16th July at 21:30h at the Harbour is the procession by the sea followed by a spectacular firework display.

Sea-land procession in honour of the Patron Saint of seafarers and fishermen. "The star of the seas"

The evening of the 16th July is a very special time for the residents of many towns in Spain for this is the night when the patron saint Virgen del Carmen is celebrated. This is one of the most deeply rooted traditions of the fishing villages and the celebrations begin with the image of the Virgin being carried through the town, towards the sea.

Accompanied by a band and often by the fishermen's wives in traditional costumes. Floral tributes are usually made to the effigy. The procession takes Her down to the local port where She is put aboard one of the fishing boats and taken out to sea, this time accompanied by the fishing fleet and almost anything else that can

sail out of the harbour. All along the coast, the tiny fishing boats, all illuminated, await her arrival. Boats sounding their horns and decorated with flowers and lanterns receive the blessing of the Virgin. Prayers are said for those lost at sea and for the protection of those that continue to make a living from the ocean. However, there is a darker side, as alcohol and water don't mix too well and it is not unusual to hear of someone falling overboard and drowning during





the festivities.

The religious masses begin on the 13th July and continue each evening until the 16th with offerings of flowers and presentations of commemorative medals. After the blessing at sea, the Virgin is carried through the streets once more to her resting place in the chapel where the 'Queen of the Seas' watches over the fishing community. The fiesta often comes to an end with a spectacular and a fine display of fireworks paying a joyous and noisy tribute to her, while shrouding her and everything else on the water in thick smoke.

The history of the Virgen del Carmen can be traced back to the old testament which tells of the prophet Elias retreating to Mount Carmelo (from which comes Carmen) in modern day Israel, where he had a vision of a cloud rising from the

This was later interpreted to be a manifestation of the Virgin Mary, and

from it comes one connection with sea farers. Another can be found in the fact that the Virgen del Carmen is known as the 'Estrella del Mar' (star of the sea) harking back to the days before GPS, when mariners navigated by the stars.

But the town's economy traditionally encompassed the sea as well, and this month it's time to remember how dangerous and for how little reward these waters have been worked







down the years. Few people are more superstitious than the people who work on the sea, so it's unsurprising that they have a much revered patron, La Virgen del Carmen, to watch over them and to whom they direct their prayers, and she is honoured on the 16th July in coastal towns and villages all over Spain, as well as in the Spanish navy.

The Virgin has given her name, of course, to women all over Spain. To understand where her name came from, however, we must travel to north-west Palestine, not far from the port of Haifa. There stands a low mountain range containing Mount Carmel, which has been considered a holy place for millennia. The name of the mountain means something like 'fertile garden', which explains why the word 'carmen' is also used in Granada to describe villas with fine gardens or orchards. It was on Mount Carmen that the Old Testament prophet Elijah had a famous confrontation with the four hundred and fifty false prophets of Baal. Elijah was determined to defend the purity of his people's faith from corruption by the worshippers of Baal, and succeeded by means of an impressive miracle involving fire from on high and a rain storm which ended a three-year drought. This would later be interpreted by the Catholic Church as a sign or message from the Virgin Mary that through her Son there would be a 'rain of grace' on sinners.

The Mount became a place where pious former pilgrims or crusaders would go to live as hermits in search of spiritual perfection and sanctity, following the example of Elijah. They lived a tough and lonely life of silence and they called themselves the Brothers of Saint Mary of Mount Carmel. Thus was born the Roman Catholic Carmelite order in the 12th century. With the failure of the crusades in the 13th century, the monks left Palestine for Europe, some settling in England, where St Simon Stock would become their leader. It was a difficult time for the order, and Simon prayed for help to the Virgin Mary. She responded by appearing to him in a vision – on the 16th July, 1251. She also brought him a gift, a garment consisting of two pieces of brown cloth which were tied together at the shoulder. It was called a scapula, and the vision informed Simon that the wearer of the scapula

could be assured of her protection and salvation from the fires of Hell. The scapula henceforth became a symbol of the Carmelite Order and also of those lay people who wanted to manifest their association with the order by wearing one under their clothes.

Three hundred years later in Spain two famous saints would become involved in reforming the order. The formidable Saint Teresa of Ávila was convinced the order was going soft and founded the much stricter branch called the 'discalced' or barefoot order of the Carmelites (although in fact they wore sandals). At her monastery in Ávila she imposed strict rules of poverty and constant abstinence on her nuns. She also persuaded St John of the Cross, the great Spanish mystic and poet, to set up similar institutions for men, which got him into considerable trouble with the authorites.

But why did the Virgen del Carmen become the patron saint of seafarers? (It is a role she shares, incidentally, with St Elmo of St Elmo's Fire fame.) The answer seems to lie in her symbolism: for a long time, the people who travelled the seas and oceans of the world depended on the stars in the night sky to guide them. In a similar way, so the reasoning goes, Mary guides her followers through the difficult waters of life, like a star of the sea. Hence the words to her hymn, known to Spanish sailors everywhere, the 'Salve Marinera', which translated reads as follows:

Hail, Star of the seas,
Rainbow of the seas,
and of eternal good
fortune.
Hail, oh Phoenix of beauty
Mother of divine love!
May your clemency
Give comfort
To the sorrows of your
people.

May our fervent cry reach unto heaven And to Thee, and to Thee. Hail, Star of the seas!



OFF THE BEATEN TRACK: DISCOVERING THE PRIORAT

ust over 30 minutes' drive inland from the Costa Dorada's beaches, the Priorat wine region is like stepping back into a remote and different world. Quiet country roads wind round dramatic rocky terrain and steeply-terraced vineyards, many of which can only be harvested by hand.

The area's harsh, slate soil -known as Ilicorella- and abundant sunshine produce some of Spain's finest and most expensive wines, blending local Grenache and Cariñena grapes with international varieties like Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot.

Over the last decade, young winemakers from around the

world have settled here to produce strong, intense reds of great character that have won international prestige and acclaim.

Winemaking has a long history in the Priorat though, back to the Middle Ages and the Carthusian monks of the La Cartoixa D'Escaladei monastery. The region's name stems from the 'Prior' of

this powerful order, who ruled over the present-day Priorat area and beyond. The region also produces outstanding olive oil, made from the small arbequina olives.

Until recently one of Catalonia's poorest comarcas (counties), the Priorat's green and stunning countryside has remained virtually unchanged —apart from some startlingly avant-garde winery buildings— while its timeless villages retain their traditional stone houses and quiet charm.

So why not take a day out and explore this fascinating corner of Catalonia? Here are a few of my favourites:

Capital and winemaking centre of the Priorat, Falset is a small but bustling town clustered around a pretty square with porched arcades, and a distinctive, Modernista-style wine cooperative. Selection of wine shops and restaurants (try La Quinoa for a sophisticated, excellent value weekdav menú del día).

La Vilella Baixa

One of the areas' most picturesque villages, nicknamed

the 'New York of the Priorat' for its spectacular seven and eight storey buildings overlooking a stream.

The narrow road from La Vilella Baixa to Scala Dei. Poboleda and Cornudella is particularly scenic —watch out for the space age hilltop bodegas!-but not recommended to anyone that gets car sick.

Scala Dei, the 'stairway to heaven'

Headquarters of the Priorat wine DO (denomination of origin), a visit to this tiny hamlet is a must. Bars, restaurant, wine shop and tasting.

About a mile away the ruined monastery of La Cartoixa de Scala Dei is well worth a visit too, with its reconstruction of a monk's cell.

The holy mountain: Montsant

The little village of Morera de Montsant nestles at the foot of the fantastic cliffs of the sierra de Montsant range, a natural park. Seemingly impossible paths snake up the mountain; some involve sheer drops, rocks overhanging very narrow paths and iron rings hammered into the rock!

Once you're at the top —on a clear day you can see the Pyrenees— a network of paths lead through beautiful scenery with streams, pools, caves and woodland. It's easy to get lost though (particularly in autumn), so go with a local guide unless you're an experienced excursionist.

A good place to stop for lunch is the **Venta de Pubill**, where the T-702 Poboleda road meets the C242. An old coaching inn, it serves traditional Catalan cuisine with freshingredients

at a reasonable price. Great for hearty breakfasts too.

Tiny, quaint hilltop hamlet with a Romanic church and ruined castle, and fabulous views of the surrounding mountains and reservoir below. Siurana is a Mecca for rock climbers worldwide, and you will be sure to see some on the spectacular drive up to the village. There is a campsite, a mountain refuge, a bar and a restaurant.

Siurana is rich in legends, and was one of the last Moorish villages to surrender to the Christian re-conquest, after a long and bitter siege.

Porrera

Large, picturesque village much loved by Barcelona weekender's; Catalan singer-songwriter and cultural icon Lluís Llach has a home and winery nearby. Porrera suffered substantial damage in catastrophic floods in 1994.

Pradell de la Teixeta - La Torre de Fontaubella -Marcà

The route through these pretty villages runs through softer countryside, close to one of Catalonia's loveliest train rides: the Reus to Mora line. A large ruined masia near Marçà was headquarters of the International Brigades in the Spanish Civil War.


CHALLENGES OF GARDENING IN CATALUNYA

irm safe paths are essential A NETWORK OF TERRACES AND PATHS layout of flower beds, terraces. features of any garden. by Clodagh and Dick Handscombe, rockeries, ponds etc. arrived at by When we paid our first visit gardening in Spain for over twenty five years. Authors trial and error. It being very easy

to our new house back in 1988 the paths around the house had

yet to be laid and the builder offered us the choice of a square of concrete paths around the house with either no gap or a gap for plants between the wall of the house and the edge of the path or a natural path of interesting coloured slabs of rock set in sand which would be more in keeping with the design of the house and local inland valley environment. We chose the latter as it would be more in keeping with the natural garden we planned, was no more expensive and we envisaged low growing herbs planted between the rocks. When we came out a again in June the paths were laid and light rains had settled the sand between the slabs of perfectly levelled paths. However within a week we had three days of heavy thunderstorms. The previously firm sun backed red clay soil became a thick paste. When one walked along the paths the slabs sunk titled and slid out of line and mud oozed up in the gaps. The paths were no longer easy to walk on and indeed would be dangerous for the elderly visitors expected later in the summer. The answer was to go round the pathway relaying them on a concrete base and giving up the idea of plants between slabs. This was done and some interesting curves made in the original straight line. The path has never moved and was extended to reach various features as the first half our the garden was completed. When there was time the second part of the garden was laid out more informally and paths were created by laying stone chippings on strips of black plastic. These were stable by the first rains and have never needed any relaying just an occasional brushing or raking to keep them tidy. The use of stone chippings also enabled changes to be made to the final





to change the direction, width

A very important decision before finalising the network of paths was to decide what terraces we would require to enable an outdoor lifestyle throughout the year, their sizes and where to best place them, and what surfaces to use. Terraces were planned and constructed for winter and summer eating out and siestas. The summer ones with shade and the winter ones with sheltered winter sun. The network of straight, curving and at times narrowing paths was then finalised to join the terraces and create an interesting meander through the garden and not just the fastest route from door to door and to the washing line. Stepping stones were used to provide weeding access to rockery areas.

We have related this personal story to highlight the benefits of not leaving the decisions on paths to the builder and that there are a wide range of options. These are expanded on in Chapter 2.4 of 'Your Garden in Spain - From planning to planting and maintenance'. The ISBN number is 978-84-89954-670.

Due to a lack of space and money the animal shelters ask you "please do not abandon your animals .A dog is a part of your family, you wouldn't abandon your child, so why do it to your pet?"

I would also like to clear up a few misconceptions and clarify the laws regarding domestic animals.

Firstly, you must microchip your dog in order to comply with the law. Non compliance carries a fine of up to 400 euros. If you move house you must notify your veterinarian to update the microchip information. We have many dogs who were found wandering in good condition and often with a collar, but without a microchip we cannot locate their owners.

Secondly, it is NOT necessary for your dog or cat to have a litter before it is sterilised. Uncontrolled breeding is the principal problem of the animal shelters, as many of these puppies and kittens end up homeless. For every dog which



is adopted there are many more in our shelters.

Your dog or cat can be sterilised before it has it's first season, which in cats can be as early as six months old and a dog a year. If you are too late and it has already been mated. the vet can give a drug to abort the pregnancy and then after her Shelters.

season finishes she can safely be sterilised

If it is too late for this the operation can be carried out on the pregnant bitch abort the pregnancy and sterilise. In some circumstances we can help with the cost of sterilisation.

Another option is a six monthly injection which

can be given to prevent the bitch from coming into season. You should discuss all the options with your vet, who will know what's best for you.

Puppies and kittens are adorable but they all grow up and the extra mouths to feed are YOUR responsibility.

Male dogs should also be sterilised, it doesn't change their personality but it does help prevent wandering in search of a mate. Thirdly, if you encounter a stray dog, first report it to your local aiuntament and vet, who can check for identification. Your last stop should be the animal shelter. Mistreating or abandoning a dog carries a fine of up to
