

### **NEWS IN SPAIN**

pain Weather - Monday June 21 2010 Summer starts at 1,28pm this afternoon, and the experts say it will be one of the hottest ever, with average highs reaching one or two degrees more than normal. The Spanish Meteorological Agency says the high temperatures will no doubt be in the form of heat waves accompanied by storms. July and September will be drier than normal, especially inland.

arcelona clinic faces fine for treating homosexuality as an illness. The Health Department of the Catalan Generalitat Government has opened an investigation into the Tibidabo Policlinica in Barcelona for applying treatments to 'cure' homosexuality. The clinic has been using a mixture of pills and psychiatric treatment for the 'cure', according to the City Councillor for Health, Marina Geli, who reminded the clinic that homosexuality is not an illness. She said that people who requested the therapy should not confuse emotional changes with their own sexuality whatever that might be. She said diverse sexual orientation is a freedom and right protected by law in Spain. If the investigation concludes the clinic has been treating homosexuality as an illness, they face a fine,

arcelona bans the Burka. Barcelona will be the first large city in Spain to ban the full Islamic veil, the Burka, and the Nigab scarf in municipal buildings.

according to Catalan newspaper El

Periódico.

The law is to be enforced by decree which will be signed by the Barcelona Socialist Mayor, Jordi Hereu. It will also





restrict the use of balaclava helmets. motorbike helmets and any other clothing or headwear which stops people from being identified. Girona and Tarragona have held votes to reach the same decision, following the other Catalan towns of Lleida and El

Vendrell which started the crackdown. Legal advisors told the Barcelona Mayor that he could not ban the clothing in the street, but could do so in the City Hall, Civic Centres, Libraries, Markets and Nurseries. Hereu defended the decision as a 'security measure' and as an expression of common sense, and denied that in any way was he acting

**Imost** million Euro in compensation for drug taking couple whose child was taken




into care. A ruling from the High Court of Justice in Cataluña, TSJC, has ordered the regional government to compensate a drug taking couple to the tune of just under a million € for having taken their son into care, and then passing the child on to another couple for adoption. The court considered that the regional social services removed the child from his biological parents without taking into account the progress that they were making in a drug detoxification centre. The biological parents can have no further access to the child, but will now receive 980,000 € in compensation, according to a statement from their lawyers IPSUM. They argued that the parents voluntarily joined a drug detoxification centre after the child's birth, but the social services considered the couple as being 'extremely fragile' and without the possibility of recovering the child.



### **NEWS IN SPAIN**

he Santander Bank and BBVA lead the lastest

ranking of top solvent European banks. The Spanish government said that Santander bank and BBVA were at the top of a list of solvent European banks following an investigation into the solvency of 30 banks carried out by the European Banking Supervisory Committee. Although the type of tests the banks were subjected to will not be published until July the information was released following a bilateral meeting between the Spanish President, José Luis Rodríguez Zapatero and the British Prime Minister, David Cameron in Brussels. This week the President of BBVA. Francisco González, called for more transparency in European banking. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) also said that the publication of the results of the European Banking Supervisory Committee should help restore confidence in European markets. The type of testing carried out on the banks investigated whether the banks could survive in negative market conditions. The first round of tests was carried out in 2009. However, the results were not published although a statement was made saying the European banking sector was resistant to the crisis. Yesterday Emilio Botín, the Chairman of Santander, said that the results were very good news. He said that Santander was the first European bank in terms of capital





and profits and now he was very pleased that it was the top of the list of solvent European banks. The third Vice-Chairman of Santander bank, Matías Rodríguez Inciarte, said that the results were a test of the strength of banking and would help normalize the markets. He also stressed that 'transparency was fundamental' in order to recover normality. Santander bank also defended the European banking system as a whole saying that there were no solvency problems in the European banking system. Inciarte said that he believed that tension in the markets was purely 'circumstantial'. He also pointed out that the European Central Bank had the capacity to provide liquidity to banks in the Eurozone.





I hope some of you found the last article interesting in which I narrated my comings and goings on a duty-barrister day. As I couldn't tell the rest of the tale due to a lack of space, I have no choice but to do it today. I apologize up front to those who are not interested.

Well, I commented that at the Catalan police

station I first assisted a frightened young man who had been found carrying illegal substances destined for trafficking, to be precise, hashish and cocaine, and such was his desperation that he preferred to be sent to prison than to continue struggling from day to day. I managed, without much effort, to make him understand that prison is not a suitable place for anybody, and much less for someone who, because of his age, has his whole life before him. That prison does not shelter the needy neither does it resolve the problems of anyone and that he should instead begin to think about the possibility of asking for help from suitable professionals to help cure himself of the addictions that he suffered from, then once cured he would be rehabilitated back into society and could work or study. We agreed on a strategy for the following day at court and he was taken once again to his cell.

18.30 - Statements are taken from the two charged with shoplifting in a supermarket. The value of the stolen goods is under 400€, for which after the statements and at my request, they are set free.

20.00 - The person charged with domestic violence has to make a statement. Following my advice he refuses to declare to the police, and once alone, I ask him to tell me what happened. He says he has been living with his partner for two years in a rented flat in Reus and according to what was said he infers that his partner had had an affair with a colleague from work and since he had suspected this the fights between them had become quite frequent, that he only shouted and insulted but had never assaulted her. He told me that the previous early morning, when he returned home after having been with some friends, they started an argument but without telling me the motive behind it. I deducted that, as in most cases like this, alcohol also participated in the fight and after asking, he admitted that he was drunk and believes his partner was too, that they both drink to excess often and whenever they drink they always end up arguing. As I have no access to the police statement I inform him that until the following day at court, I would not have access to his partner's version of the events.

20.45 - Finally, I assist another young man, 26 years old, who had been detained 'in fraganti' robbing inside a car.

He doesn't make a statement either, and when we are alone he tells me he broke a window with a stone because from the outside he had seen a purse inside the car but found that it only had some keys and some coins of 5, 20 and 50 cents inside, no more than 4€ in total but when he was about to leave he was detained by a

Catalan police patrol and as he couldn't run fast enough to escape, he was detained. He also has problems with drugs, neither does he work and his way of life consists of robberies and other minor offences and all the money he makes from this is spent on drugs. I advise him that he has no defence and the best thing to do would be to make a deal with the prosecutor. He already knows the procedure as this is the third time he has been detained so he takes my advice.

21.15 - I am summonsed for 9am the following day in

### On the following day this was the result of the cases:

After the pertinent declaration, the judge agrees to my petition of letting free the young man charged with drug trafficking. He is obliged to put in an appearance on the 1st and 15th of each month and I would call him when a place is available for him at a detox centre. The truth is that it was no use, some days later he was caught again with drugs, this time a more significant amount, and the outcome was just as he wished, he is on remand waiting to be tried and now he has two lawsuits filed against

The partner of my client refused to make a statement and withdrew the accusation so the charges were dropped with both of them leaving the court in a very affectionate manner. I really hope they learned their lesson and they keep away from alcohol if the act of drinking turns their lives into an inferno.

As for the young man who shoplifted, he agreed to serve his sentence in a detox centre and if he follows the rules of the centre he will get back his liberty in about six months' time and if the system works perhaps he will be able to rebuild his life.

Summing up, it was a day just like any other and once more I can confirm that in many cases addictions lead to





# NEWS HOUNDS & MORE...NEWS BY DR. RONALD ROSENFELD D.V.M. DOGS HELP DOCTORS DETECT CANCER



You may be the master, but I nose all your secrets!



If dogs are able to smell the presence of a person buried under tons of rubble or find crumbs of hashish hidden in some obscure corner of an automobile, is it unreasonable to think that they may also be of use in medicine? In 2004 a small study published in the 'British Medical Journal' demonstrated that dogs could precisely detect bladder cancer by smelling urine samples. Since then various foundations around the world have investigated this further and have trained dogs to do this! It should be noted that despite the results achieved dogs are still a long

There is a foundation in Hungary (Fundación Perros contra el Cáncer para la Vida) that has trained four dogs, of different breeds, (two of which are proven for their work in disasters) to successfully detect, by smelling, cancer in patients. Their results are not yet published but have a 99% success rate in a study involving 35 patients with lung cancer and 45 individuals in the control group.

way away from being considered oncology consultants.

The same success rate was achieved in 2006 by a group of Polish and American Scientists, working with five animals, able to identify patients with breast or lung tumours. This work has been published in 'Integrative Cancer Therapies', carried out by the Pine Street Foundation located in California.

In this study, as in the majority of earlier research, the dogs do not smell the patients directly, rather the air they exhale into special hermetically sealed containers. This represented one of the largest studies carried out with 86 cancer patients (55 with lung tumours and 31 with breast tumours), while there were 83 individuals in the healthy control group. Following the success of this experiment the

foundation announced on their web page that they were recruiting patients for a study on ovarian tumours.

The studies by the foundation, until now, are comparing the animal detection studies with results from traditional biopsies, which is what they will continue to do. They do not pretend to offer the dogs as a substitute to traditional methods rather as a complimentary test. The dogs are not available to patients to be smelled directly, rather they are attempting to determine if they can smell and detect an anomaly in the exhaled breath of the patients. They stress that for the present time this is not a first line diagnostic

tool, rather to determine if there is a substance that may be able to be detected by an electronic nose, that could be incorporated into a clinic, as opposed to having a dog sitting next to a patient on an exam table in an oncology clinic. There is a lot of work to be done yet to understand what substances are produced and emitted from cancer cells that are able to be detected by dogs.

### Summer, Hot Temps, Cars & Dogs Do Not Go Together.

Many well meaning owners leave their dogs in their cars with the windows slightly open when they do errands only to come back & find their dog dead. It happened to a contestant auditioning for the "American Idol" singing talent show. The terrier dog was left in the car in Denver on a 91 degree day. By the time the owner came back, the dog was dead.

Even opening the windows is not enough to ventilate a hot car where the inside temperature can increase by 30 degrees in just half an hour. And it only takes a matter of 5-10 minutes on a hot day for a dog to wind up organ-damaged or dead.





### Farfalle Piccanti - ready in less then 20 minutes

Ingredients for 4 people -

- 400g of farfalle pasta (penne works too)
- 150g of chopped pitted green olives and 100g of spicy green olives
- 3 cloves of chopped garlic
- · Seasoning and herbs: salt & black pepper, pinch of chilli flakes, fresh basil or parsley
- Olive oil
- 8 blanched chopped plum tomatoes and 1 table spoon of tomato purée (you can use a





good handfull of small chopped cherry tomatoes instead of plum tomatoes)

- · Parmigiano (optional)
- White wine (optional)

Boil water and cook pasta for 1 minute less then the recommended time.

In a large saucepan, sautee the garlic and chilli flakes in olive oil on low heat until lightly golden.

Add chopped olives, chopped tomatoes and seasoning, cook on medium heat for around 10 minutes.

Sprinkle boiling water from the pasta pot or a little white wine if the sauce gets too dry.

When the pasta is ready, drain, but save 1 cup of the water.

Add the pasta to the sauce, add the fresh basil or parsley and cook together for 2 minutes, if needed, sprinkle some of the saved water to make sure the pasta does not get too dry.

Disable Superfetch to Save Memory and speed up Windows Vista

Windows Vista Superfetch learns your typical activities with files and application access. By learning, it predicts your computer use actions and puts your most commonly used applications in memory. This is great if you have a lot of RAM, but if you have less than 2GB, then I suggest you disable this feature - saving you from sluggish computer use.

Please Note: Even with less than 2GB of ram, you may find this doesn't help. If you notice no difference after a day or two, then you can probably re-enable Superfetch.

To disable Superfetch, do the following:

- 1. Press Start, type services in the search bar and press Enter
- 2. Locate Superfetch in the list of services, right click it, and select properties
- 3. Change the Startup Type dropdown box to disabled and click the stop button
- 4. Now click OK

- 5. Right click on the key and select Modify...
- 6. Change the value from 20000 to 5000. This can potentially reduce your shut down time by 15 seconds.



He is joined by Fermín Morales (Yull Núñez), a teenage boy who admires Ignacio and wishes to become a juglar like him. Carrillo reluctantly accepts, given his loneliness. On Ash Wednesday 1968, Carrillo, Morales and their donkey start a journey throughout

several towns in the Caribbean region in Northern Colombia, until Taroa (a small caserío in Uribia jurisdiction), in La Guajira desert, where Carrillo's maestro supposedly lives. During their journey, Carrillo participates in the first version of the Vallenato Legend Festival in Valledupar.

Written and directed by Ciro Guerra. It was filmed in 80 locations in Northern Colombia. The film is spoken in Spanish, Palenquero, Wayuunaiki, and Ikun. It can be said it is similar in many ways to the Motorcycle Diaries as a road trip of the soul.

### Summer Planting for Apartments. By Clodagh and Dick Handscomb Practical gardeners living in Spain for 25 years

summers any cooler so ensure that you don't waste money on unsuitable plants or the loss of plants due to poor positioning, planting and care this summer especially if living in an apartment or town house.

3. Plants that are best grown in semi shade - and there are many such plants to choose from such as hydrangeas, fuchsias

4. Plants that can live in more shaded positions most of the time if there is reflected light such as aspidistras, Christmas cacti and Cinerarias.

5. Northern European house plants such as the Peacock plant and Peace lily that can be coaxed to survive in semi shaded terrace positions.

Each description includes a clear and Carrefour and if more convenient indication of the plants thirstiness, salt tolerance in case you are near the sea or salt pans, frost resistance if in the inland towns and villages and whether perfumed such as the Lady of the Night, Carnations or French Marigolds. By the way plants are listed in the descriptions by botanical names but there is also a plant list by English names with the page numbers of the descriptions. So experienced and

And there are other risks to be taken into account. Firstly the compost in which plants are supplied is often good for growing plants under mass production conditions in hothouses but dries out too quickly under typical home garden and terrace conditions.

Secondly many types of compost for repotting plants are not ideal so it is best to make your own blends using a mix of a peat based compost, worm compost and sand. A good garden centre will be able to advice on the best brands to use.

As we said last month many apartment blocks could do with more colourful balconies for the enjoyment of residents and passers by.

the same venue and from 1995 this annual event became known as the Catalunya MotoGP. The circuit is one of motor sport's most popular testing grounds allowing teams of corners.

The Catalunya MotoGP is the most stylish round on the race calendar. By the time the GP circus makes a second trip of the season to Spain the pace is hotting up and the tough are showing their mettle. The race takes place only one week after the Dutch TT being on a Saturday; the season is getting serious.

Unfortunately, MotoGP is no longer very entertaining as there are only 16 bikes on the grid but fortunately, MotoGP 2 has around 40 bikes and the 125cc have around between 30 & 40 bikes which makes for great racing. More overtaking in one race than an entire around the entire circuit and all the general admission season of Formula 1!!

The 4.727 km (2.937-mile) track consisting of 5 left and 8 right corners as well as a long straight of 1047m was built for both Formula 1 and motorcycle GP racing, and this introduces a special complication for riders and technicians.

The huge braking forces generated by the cars causes the tarmac to distort on the corner entries. Historically, this washboard effect has made things difficult for the suspension engineers and even more so for the riders.

GETTING THERE. Only 32 km from Barcelona and 18 km from the Maresme Coast, the Circuit is located between two major communication roads. Careful sign-posting around the Circuit helps visitors to reach their destination without problems. When travelling by car, follow the C-17 road (exit Montmeló), or the AP-7 highway. Reality TV star Katie Price's perfume has pulled been from Superdrug's shelves because "ethical" easons. according to the high street store. It coincides with another perfume range, Spoof, by Vacherie, also

being withdrawn.

That followed a report claiming the fragrances were made 'from the blood, sweat and tears of Indian workers.' And they meant literally.

The report claims that a factory in Mumbai making clothes for a well known low-cost high street fashion store, attaches

tubing to their workforce in order to extract the ingredients for the perfume. The workers are paid well, but the working conditions are far from ideal, so the ingredient recovery is very effective.

A spokeswoman for the company said that the ratios of ingredients were naturally adjusted to give the correct 'notes' for each fragrance. "A hot summer produces a muskier scent with a salty tang," she explained, "whereas pinker, copperyscented themes are associated with temporary holiday workers and an increased industrial accident rate."

Surprisingly, this was enough to prompt several high street stores to withdraw all Spoof perfume on ethical grounds.

The Spoof perfume range consists of two distinct fragrances; Spoof by Night, a dark, exotic scent guaranteed to spice up an evening rendezvous, and Spoof Sportiff, for splashing in your trainers after two hours in the gym.

SPENDING the night in an NHS hospital is better than living on the street, according to Britain's most demented vagrant.



Prickly heat is a rash that appears on the skin due to excessive sweating, especially in the summer season. They are also popularly known as heat rashes or sweat rashes. In medical terminology, prickly heat is known as miliaria rubra or simply miliaria. Prickly heat occurs because the excessive sweating caused due to the external heat temporarily blocks the sweat glands, due to which a proper purification of the blood does not occur.

The common symptoms of prickly heat are small eruptions on the skin which are small and grainy in nature. They could

be red, or they could even be just a shade darker than the colour of the skin. These eruptions are always itchy and they are accompanied by a prickly burning sensation. For children, prickly heat is always very uncomfortable. In addition, there is always a chance of a more serious bacterial infection once the prickly heat has occurred.

### Home Remedies for Prickly Heat

time, but we must remember that each of us has a unique kind of skin. Hence, the patent formulations may not work, and may actually aggravate the condition.

Therefore, it is much safer to use some herbal and natural remedies, which will not have side-effects even if used in an excess amount. The following is a list of some of the most effective home remedies for prickly heat to apply when heat rashes occur.

This is a very elaborate, but certain method to remove the prickly heat. Take an earthen vessel. Fill it with clean water. Take about fifteen to twenty gooseberries (amalaki, Emblica officinalis). Wipe each gooseberry in turn and add it to the water in the pot. Then cover the earthen pot with a lid. Let the gooseberries remain in the pot for one whole night. In the morning, the fruits will have become soft. Mash the gooseberries in the water itself. Then strain the water, add sugar in it and drink. Drink as much as you need to quench your thirst. This remedy removes the heat from the body. The prickly heat is treated within about seven days. There

are other benefits too. The stomach will remain clear and digestion will be improved. This is one of the useful home remedies for prickly heat.

Make a paste of cornstarch or baking soda in water. Apply this paste onto the portion of the skin affected by the heat rash. Let this paste remain there for about half an hour. Within this time, the paste will dry completely. Then take a cold water bath and wash the paste away. Otherwise, you can use a towel soaked in cold water and apply this cold compress onto the skin. Either way, your skin will cool down and you will get relief from the prickly heat inflammation. This is one of the important natural remedy.

Drink several glasses of citrus fruit juices, especially limejuice in a day. You can have juices from oranges, sweet lemons, watermelons, pineapples, etc. These cool down the body and arm it against the external heat.

Neem soaps are easily available in the market. Having a bath with this soap, especially in the summer season, will keep the prickly heat away. It is also a good remedy if you already have prickly heat eruptions.

You can make a fine powder of sandalwood and dust it all over your body. This will also be very helpful in keeping the prickly heat in check.

Cut open a watermelon. Then take it peels off. Eat the fruit.

It will provide coolness in the body. Then apply the peels on the prickly heat affected areas. Use the inside portion to rub on the skin. Such a remedy cools the body from the inside as well as the outside, and helps to get the prickly heat treated soon. This is the best diet for prickly heat.

### **Precautions for Prickly Heat**

(i) Avoid hot and humid climates as much as possible.

(ii) Do not exert yourself so much that you produce more sweat.

(iii) If sweat occurs on the body, clean it

off as soon as possible. If you can, have a bath to remove the sweat, or at least wipe off the body with a rough towel in order to unclog the sweat pores.

(iv) Try to use air-conditioning wherever possible.

(v) In summer air circulation is very important. If there is no air conditioner, at least keep the room well-ventilated. Also wear loose cotton clothes to allow the air to pass through. (vi) Have a bath several times a day in the summer season, if your work involves a lot of sweating. Also, very important to remember, have a bath in the night before going to bed.

Or else the sweat will dry up on the skin and will possibly cover the sweat pores by morning.

(vii) Drink lots of water in the summer season. This helps to keep the sebaceous (sweat) glands functional.




