

NEWS IN SPAIN

oyal Navy accused of firing at the Spanish flag off Gibraltar El Mundo reports that tensions between Gibraltar and Spain are rising after the Guardia Civil came across a British Navy patrol which, the paper says, was carrying out firing practice



last Tuesday on a buoy on which the Spanish flag was printed. El Mundo reports that the British cleared away their exercise when they noted the presence of the Guardia Civil, but the paper highlights that they had been firing at the Spanish flag. The paper says that incidents between the Guardia Civil and the British Navy patrols around The Rock are ever more common. Spain believes such incidents only benefit the smugglers in the area and the Spanish Government indicated over the summer that they want to reach a new agreement with Britain on the joint control of the waters around Gibraltar. The new British Ambassador in Madrid, Giles Paxman, has been called in to give an explanation, and is reported by El Mundo to have presented his 'excuses' for the 'error of judgement and lack of sensitivity' by members of the Royal Navy. The Partido Popular has asked the Spanish Foreign Minister, Miguel Ángel Moratinos, to explain the incident to Congress.

atalan family forced to live away from their home for 16 months A Catalan family have had their flat occupied by squatters for the past 16 months, and the City Hall continues to charge them



the rent. If the couple stops those payments they will lose their right to the property managed by the City Hall housing department, and they have to pay the electricity, gas, telephone and water bills for the same reason. Josep M. and his wife lived in the El Raval area of the city and were on holiday for a few days when the squatters broke into their home on July 21 last year. When they rushed home on hearing the news from a neighbour they found the locks had been changed. They immediately placed a denuncia with the regional police, Los Mossos d'Esquadra, but now a judge has refused to order the eviction of the squatters as they are considered to have no means. The couple's lawyer, Esther Villaescusa, is quoted by El País as describing the situation as 'surrealist'. A few days ago the couple were advised by a neighbour that the squatters where

'throwing things onto the street'. The couple rushed there and managed to save a television. The wife told EI País 'It may not be worth much, but it is mine, like everything else in the flat. The squatters have even replaced the names on the buzón letter box for the flat with their own.

ottery sellers in Spain worried about privatisation Lottery sellers in Spain are protesting at what they consider is a back-door privatisation of their business. As the world famous Gordo Christmas Lottery approaches, queues can be seen at most of the lottery administration offices where tickets can be purchased, but that could all change. The Government is reported to be considering opening up part of the National Lottery to the private sector, which would mean that ticket selling machines could be seen in commercial and other centres. Earlier this month Congress approved two motions which will allow any company to be allowed to sell Spanish State lottery tickets, and those who work in the current lottery administration offices say the Government is planning the liberalisation of state lotteries without even consulting them. The 250 year old National Lottery in Spain is run by the Director General of Lotteries and State Bets, LAE, General Director, Gonzalo Fernández,



has denied that privatisation is taking place, noting that the products and the network are not being touched. He said all that was being done was opening the door to the use of new technologies in ticket sales. Even now by using the Internet people can choose where to buy their 'Gordo' lottery ticket. As the draw approaches on December 22, the statisticians tell us that Madrid, Barcelona, Valencia and Alicante are the luckiest provinces and tickets ending in a 3,7 or 9 are the most popular.







30 corruption cases open against politicians across Spain There are a total of 730 cases of corruption currently open in the Spanish judiciary, 594 judicial proceedings and 136 investigations opened by the prosecutors' office. The Socialist party is the one most affected. wingers IU, and 17 against the now defunct GIL party which was based in Marbella. The remaining cases come from Unión Mallorquina, Esquerra Republicana de Catalunya, the Bloque Nactionalista Galego and the PNV Basque Nationalists. The number represents about 1% of the total number of 66,000 councillors and mayors across the country. The numbers were given in Congress on Wednesday by the Attorney General, Cándido Conde-Pumpido, who in answer to a Partido Popular question, said the data showed that the judiciary was working against all political parties, He ended his statement with a call for calm from the public.

impossible for many people so renting property has suddenly become popular. Until a short time ago, renting was thought to be an investment without return and that it was much more appropriate to purchase but now, with so many obstacles to overcome in order to obtain the necessary finance, the tenant has once more come into his/her own in which case I consider it worthy to briefly summarise rental contract details.

At present, town rentals are subject to Law 29/1994, of the 24th of November although certain points of earlier laws are applied in specific cases. This law includes the rental of town property and business premises and excludes, among others, the seasonal rental of houses and rental of rural property, even though it consists of house + room, if the main object of the contract is to make use of the land.

The duration of the rental agreement will be agreed to by both parties. But one has to bear in mind, that if the period that appears in the contract is less than five years, it will automatically be prolonged to five years if the tenant so wishes.

The obligations of the landlord are basically to hand over to the tenant the property named in the contract and

maintain it in optimum living conditions. On the other hand, the tenant must pay the amount agreed to as well as any corresponding expenses, treat the property with due care, refrain from construction/building work unless authorised by the landlord, as well as taking care of small repairs whenever necessary or informing the landlord of any repairs that need to be done.

If the case arises that the tenant does not pay the rent, the landlord could lodge an official complaint before the trial court of the area in which the property is located requesting that the tenant be evicted and that the money owed be duly paid.

The rental contract and the documents which show the breach of contract should be submitted along with the official complaint, which must be presented by a lawyer or solicitor, plus a declaration from the landlord to say that he could halt the process if the tenant pays the total amount due, but this option can only be applied on one occasion.

One can appeal to the Provincial Court against the sentence passed, but the money owed must be paid up beforehand. Otherwise, the appeal will not be processed.

NEWS HOUNDS & MORE...WORKING WITH DOGS-THERAPEUTIC EFFECTS: REDUCING fhe Risk of Heart Disease and Other Benefits... BY Dr. Ronald Rosenfeld D.V.A

The therapeutic







HEALTH SELF-HELP TOOLKIT: MEDITATION - TRAINING THE MIND



This month I have come across all kinds of venues where people are using meditation as a body-mind linking tool to restore health and balance to their lives. from Mora to Vilafranca. These places offer useful

practices which can stand alone, along with or without any other belief systems. This is a refreshing & medicinal development in these complex & demanding times. A poster I saw for an upcoming weekend meditation workshop puts it well:

"TURNING YOUR MIND INTO AN ALLY

The majority of us are slaves to our own mind. Our own mind is our worst enemy. We try to keep our centre, but our mind scatters. We try to keep stress at bay, but our anxiety keeps us awake at night. We try to be good to the people we love but we forget

& end up more preoccupied with ourselves. And when we want to try and change our lives we hurl ourselves into spiritual practices, hoping to get immediate results, but lose our way once our initial desire for change cools down. "

By training our mind through the practice of meditation we can stabilise and forge an alliance with ourselves which allows us to use our mind instead of it using us. It is a simple practice which anyone can do. If we want to lessen our confusion & the pain we habitually feel and be of help to others & the planet, we need to accept the responsibility to learn what our mind is and how it functions, independent of any of our belief systems. When

we see how the mind works. we also see how our life works. That transforms us.

And a group started on a monthly basis in my local village of El Perelló to do a full moon meditation, organized with the help and blessing of

the local Ajuntament. There were 45 of us in the room, about 30 Catalan women and assorted others, a fine turnout. We were given a beautiful, clear description of the mindfulness meditation technique used by Tibetan buddhist schools as a grounding presence practice, by Antonio Grandon of the Kagyu Samye Dzong school. The

> introduction to the practice was in Castillano, which we English-speakers all managed to understand enough to do pretty much what everyone else was doing (I think!) & in future there will be a resumé in English if needed. The room was like a deep quiet river at times, the questions/answers afterwards were great - completely

unphilosophical, about how this related to our everyday lives - and it felt very sane.

The full moon meditations will explore meditation techniques from various traditions, the next one being asana techniques used in the yoga path. This broad approach perfectly embodies the respect needed for the multiple wisdom traditions which exist that needs fostered so dearly to get us through these coming times.

DIA DE LA CONSTITUCION- NATIONAL HOLIDAY DEC 6TH

The constitutional history of Spain dates back to the constitution of 1812. After the death of dictator Francisco Franco in 1975, a general election in 1977 convened the Constituent Cortes (the Spanish Parliament, in its capacity as a constitutional assembly) for the purpose of drafting and approving the constitution.

A seven-member panel was selected among the elected members of the Cortes to work on a draft of the Constitution to be submitted to the body. These came to be known, as the media put it, as the padres de la Constitución or "fathers of the Constitution". These seven people were chosen to represent the wide (and often, deeply divided) political spectrum within the Spanish Parliament,

while the leading role was given to then ruling party and now defunct Unión de Centro Democrático.

The writer (and Senator by Royal appointment) Camilo José Cela later polished the draft Constitution's wording. However, since much of the consensus depended on keeping the wording ambiguous, few of Cela's proposed re-wordings were approved.

The constitution was approved by the Cortes Generales on October 31, 1978, and by the Spanish people in a referendum on December 6, 1978, before being promulgated by King Juan Carlos on December 27. It came into effect on December 29, the day it was published in the Official Gazette. Constitution Day on December 6 has since been a national holiday in Spain.

It set out how government would be run, what powers they had and determined the governmental system that Spain operates on today. Constitution day is a celebration of the day Spain became a democracy. Other constitutional provisions recognize the right to adequate housing, employment, social welfare provision, health protection and pensions. Since 1978 the constitution has been reformed just once in order to give citizens of EU member states living in Spain the right to vote and stand as candidates in local elections. This day is principally

seen as the start of the December holidays and a long weekend is normally taken in conjunction with the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. In recent years however, Constitution Day has become more popular for protest marches and political statements.

The flag of Spain, as it is defined in the Spanish Constitution of 1978, is divided into three horizontal stripes: red, yellow and red, the yellow stripe being twice the size of each red stripe. The state and war flags and ensigns must be charged with the Spanish coat of arms, while the civil flag and ensign leaves the inclusion of the coat of arms as optional. The coat of arms must be placed at 1/3 the flag's length towards the hoist, and the height of the coat of arms should

measure two fifths of the flag's width (i.e. hoist).

Throughout the 18th, 19th, and 20th centuries, this colour scheme remained intact, being the only changes centred on the coat of arms. In the modern flag, the coat of arms is greatly simplified as compared to previous variants.

The coat of arms consists of a crowned shield. Each of the four quadrants represent one of the four kingdoms that were merged to form a unified Spain at the end of the 15th century. Namely, the kingdoms are: Castile, represented by the castle, León, represented by the lion, Aragon, represented by the vertical alternating red and yellow stripes (four red stripes, five yellow stripes), and Navarre, represented by the linked chains. Also the moorish kingdom of Granada is represented by the pomegranate fruit in the bottom of the coat of arms. The impaled fleur

de lys represents the ruling House of Borbón. The two columns with the "plus ultra" ensign (meaning "there is more beyond" in Latin) represent Spanish discovery and colonization of America, the columns being the mythological Pillars of Hercules (of the Strait of Gibraltar, gateway to the Atlantic Ocean). The "Plus Ultra" phrase replaced the former "Non Plus Ultra" (something like "No further from here") before the discovery of America, since Spain was considered "the Westernmost point" on Earth (thus, "no further from here")

`IMMACULATE FESTIVAL & COMMEMORATION OF THE SIEGE OF 1640 IN CAMBRILS"

December 8-Feast of the Immaculate (Inmaculada Concepcior -National Holiday) This holiday in Spain is typically a day of additional church services in and around Madrid as well as in the rest of the country. This Spanish holiday is based on the Catholic dogma that states that while becoming pregnant the Virgin Mary did not suffer the "original sin" as she was "filled by god" and as such the conception was "immaculate". Note that between the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and the Constitution Day the Spanish get two days off during this week, so many take the whole week off in the biggest puente of the year.

Immaculate Conception

Our Lady was conceived without original sin. She had a perfect purity, with no bad inclinations. Therefore, she had a great facility to correspond entirely with the grace of God at every moment. Natural and the supernatural grandeur merged together in her soul in a profound and extraordinary harmony. Above all others creatures, she had the highest notion of the sanctity of God and His correspondent glory. She also had the clear notion of what Creation owes to that glory. She knew that all created beings should glorify God.


December, exactly nine months before celebrating the Nativity of Mary. The feast of the Incarnation of Christ, also known as The Annunciation, is celebrated on 25 March, nine months before Christmas Day. Mary was not the product of a Virgin Birth herself; Christian tradition identifies her parents as Saints Joachim and Anne. In fact, both Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy have condemned the belief that Mary was the product of a virgin birth.




INMACULADA FESTIVAL

In December, the Castellers week takes place. On the 8th, the Inmaculada Festival is held, with a public mass in Santa Maria Church and an interesting procession with dwarves and giants, along with many other shows. The program has many different activities for residents and visitors through the streets allowing you to enjoy the customs and traditions. Theater, children's shows, concerts, sporting events, delivery of the Research Grant Awards and painting, photography id'escultura displays.

There is also the commemoration of the events of the Cambrils Siege in 1640,. The ivelihood of the township was put in serious eopardy in December of 1640, when the people of Cambrils experienced one of the worse episodes of the Catalan Revolt (Guerra dels Segadors /war of the **Reapers**) in which Catalonia clashed with King Felipe IV. Faced with a superior army, the townspeople of Cambrils resisted a terrible three-day siege before surrendering. Contrary to agreement, the occupying forces killed a large number of the defenders who had already surrendered and a good part of the town wall was destroyed. Unfortunately, this is one of the most significant historical events that has ever occurred in the town, which is why it is commemorated year after year in the Plaça del Setge, in front of the

In 2006 the Government announced some significant changes to when and the way, in which you can take the benefits from Personal Pensions, Company schemes and State benefits.

Unlike most changes in legislation this was retrospective. Most individuals in the UK will have received confirmation from their provider that the changes are imminent. However, we have discovered a number of clients living here

in Spain who have not received any notification.

This may have occurred due to changes of address not being notified to the provider.

The main changes which could impact on individuals are detailed below.

When can you take your personal pension?

By April 2010, the minimum age at which you'll be able to take your company or personal pension will have increased from 50 to 55. You can put off taking it until age 75. However, you may still be able to take your pension before age 55 in certain circumstances, for example if you are unable to work due to

ill-health. Your pension administrator will be able to tell you what your scheme allows.

Options since 2006

Following changes made to pension rules in April 2006, there is now more choice for how and when you can take your pension benefits. But bear in mind that pension schemes are subject to individual rules so you'll need to check with your pension administrator what your particular scheme allows.

A more generous tax-free lump sum

You can now take up to 25 per cent of the value of your total pension savings from all sources as a taxfree lump sum when you retire, up to a maximum of 25 per cent of the 'lifetime allowance' for that tax year.

For the tax year 2009-2010 the lifetime allowance (tested against your total pensions savings) is £1.75 million, gradually rising to £1.8 million by 2010-2011. If your total pensions savings exceed the lifetime allowance you can take the excess as a cash lump sum, subject to a 55 per cent tax charge.

> Lump sums from small pension funds

> If your total pension savings from all sources was £17.500 or less (one per cent of the 'lifetime allowance') you may be able to take the whole amount as a cash lump sum, with 25 per cent tax-

The limit for being able to take the whole fund in cash will gradually rise to £18,000 by the 2010-2011 tax year.

Drawing an income from your pension

You have the following options (after you've taken any tax-free lump sum):

· use the (remaining) fund you've built up to buy an annuity (a regular income payable for life) from a life insurance company; this does not have to be the same

draw a taxable income directly from vour pension

fund, as an 'unsecured pension' before age 75

 draw a taxable income directly from your pension fund, as an 'alternatively secured pension' from age 75 (similar to income withdrawal but with lower withdrawal limits)

TREAT YOUR TASTE BUDS



Agua de Valencia

1 bottle of Spanish cava (sparkling wine or champagne)

Plenty fresh orange juice Cointreau

Ice cubes

This is true orange growing country, and so the recipe is based on fresh orange juice, which is best. And beware, this innocuous-sounding drink is strong! Put some ice cubes into a large jug and pour over lots of orange juice. Now add the bottle of cava. Once the fizz subsides, stir in a good dash of the

cointreau and it's ready to serve. Horchata de Chufas

2/3 lb of "chufas" (also known as "tiger nuts")

1 cup of water

1 lemon peel

Put the "chufas" in a bowl of water for 12 hours. In another bowl put the lemon peel, the sugar, the water and the drained "chufas". Mix all together with the electric whisk and put the bowl in the refrigerator for 2-3 hours, then, drain all with a thin sieve, and you have the "horchata" ready..

Queimada

4-5 bottles Spanish Orujo (or other distilled liquor)

CHRISTMAS TIPPLES

2 lb white sugar A few coffee beans

A few pieces of finely sliced lemon peel
You need a huge flameproof
earthenware casserole dish for this.
Pour in all the liqueur, about two-thirds
of the sugar and the lemon peel. Stir
well, bring to the boil and allow to
bubble for about 15 minutes.

Take a tablespoon of the reserved sugar in a large serving spoon and take up some of the hot liquor from the pot. Set fire to the spoon, holding it over the pot (careful - wear an oven glove!), and when the sugar begins to bubble, lower it into the casserole, which will ignite. Repeat this another couple of times.

The longer this burns, the more alcohol with disappear... Ladle into small earthenware mugs to serve.

Christmas Tree Shooter

1/4 oz Grenadine

1/2 oz Green Creme De Menthe 1/4 oz Sambuca

Pour in that order in a Cordial or Shooter glass and flame it, (ignite the Sambuca with a match).

Note: This shooter is sometimes called a "Flaming Christmas Tree". Having seen flaming shooters go horribly wrong I strongly suggest that you enjoy this shooter by blowing out the flame soon after you serve it or without flame.



- 1. The partridge will be retained, but the pear tree never turned out to be the cash crop forecasted. It will be replaced by a plastic hanging plant, providing considerable savings in maintenance.
- 2. The two turtle doves represent a redundancy that is simply not cost effective. In addition, their romance during working hours could not be condoned. The positions are therefore eliminated.
- 3. The three French hens will remain intact. After all, everyone loves the French.
- 4. The four calling birds were replaced by an automated voice mail system, with a call waiting option. An analysis is underway to determine who the birds have been calling, how often and how long they talked.
- 5. The five golden rings have been put on hold by the Board of Directors. Maintaining a portfolio based on one commodity could have negative

implications for institutional investors. Diversification into other precious metals as well as a mix of T-Bills and high technology stocks appear to be in order.

- 6. The six geese-a-laying constitutes a luxury which can no longer be afforded. SPANISH PROPERTY TRENDS AND TIPS FOR 2010



Christmas is coming round again and the end of the year looming fast — where does the time go!? While 2009 hasn't been an easy year in the property world, things are starting

to move again. Time to take stock and look forward to the New Year, so here goes...

How low can prices go?

While Spain's economy remains in poor shape and unemployment sadly continues to rise, indications are that property prices are now dropping at a substantially slower rate. The October 2009 valuation index from TINSA—Spain's leading appraisal company and one of the few sources of reliable information—confirms this.

We are seeing a gradual but steady increase in enquiries and sales, with interest from Spanish, French, Dutch and Belgian buyers, mainly looking for second homes. They all have one thing in common: they are after a bargain and only buy if they feel they have a really good deal.

The perception is that prices will bottom out towards the end of 2010, so these buyers are starting to look now.


French, Belgian and German buyers will continue to buy easy-to-maintain and rentable second homes along the coastal strip, whether in the countryside (not too remote) or on popular estates like Les Tres Cales.

Many Dutch, Irish and Brits will still look for good deals in scenic locations in inland areas. Media coverage of illegal properties in Spain mean that buyers are very aware of potential problems. If you plan to sell a country house in 2010, be sure to deal with any potential obstacles as early as possible.

Increased interest in rentals

Rental enquiries are up from Spanish and French clients looking for long-term lets. While many people in countries

Every spring the Generalitat — Catalonia's autonomous government — makes a limited number of grants available for reforming older properties.

They are for first homes of full-time

residents of Spain, aimed to help with things like making houses compliant with habitation and sanitary standards, re-wiring, insulation, installing new bathrooms and adapting dwellings for the handicapped.

As you might expect, they will involve bureaucratic procedures and a fair amount of paperwork...

They could make all the difference to the viability of a renovation project though, so if you are planning to refurbish check now to see if you qualify and get information ready for next year.

Funds available in any year are limited, so it's vital to get your application in as soon as grants become available.

CHRISTMAS AND COMMUNAL GARDENING FOR HEALTH A Christmas challenge for 2010 if not achieved in 2009-11-09

How quickly Christmas comes round again. A time to be merry and eat well in spite of the economy. Luckily if the family are holistic gardeners and see the sense to grow not only grass and flowers much of the Christmas food can come from the garden. For us following the advice of our own books 'Your Garden in Spain', 'Growing Healthy Fruit in Spain' and ' Growing Healthy Vegetables in Spain' the following is possible without spending many hours a week growing the Christmas fare. If they are not all available to you this year they could be next year.

Some of the Christmas things from our garden.

- A diversity of fresh ecologically grown fruit and vegetables.
- Herbs for Christmas stuffings, infusions and mulled wines..
- Flowers, plants, pine cones and vergreen garlands.
- Logs for the fire.
- A turkey that has enjoyed fresh egetables as well as grains for Christmas day and partridges or rabbits for Boxing
- Fruit herb and nut flavoured liquors and wines.
- Almonds olives and vitamin packed carob pods. The latter are good to chew on a Boxing day walk. Remember they were the forerunners to Christmas.
- Dried fruits for making the Christmas pudding, cake and mince meat. We have dried grapes (raisins), mandarins, lemons and almonds about to be mixed.
- Fresh eggs.
- Pecan, walnuts and almonds for the nut crackers.
- Fresh mandarins lemons tangerines.

Establish a GROWING CIRCLE for 2010 Recognising that not everyone has the motivation, experience, space and interest in growing everything and that many Expats are looking for company, we launched the concept of Growing Circles in our November article on our website www.gardeninginspain.com.

No not the circles of flattened grain crops that still mystify agriculturalists but small groups of friends and neighbours each growing one or more crop on behalf of other members of the circle and swapping on a barter basis...

The idea is especially practical for groups of neighbours and friends living in:

- · The same village
- the same block of flats especially if all on the same or two floors
- the same urbanisation especially if all are in the same street or zone
- the same gardening club who can swap crops at weekly meetings
- the same school gardening club where groups of pupils could specialize in growing specific crops.

Remember that many fruits and vegetables can be grown in containers on apartment terraces and village house roofs if members of a circle don't have room for a raised bed or traditional vegetable plot. Naturally it is also possible that a group of friends share an allotment or adjacent allotments which are becoming available in several towns and villages for young and retired people or working part of the large garden of a friend who can no longer cope with their large garden due to infirmity.

Hopefully this idea is discussed over a few glasses of warm mulled wine during the end of year non gardening season and our books are found in a few Christmas Stockings to support the idea and enable us to buy some new vegetable seeds for spring planting.

Belén Not content with a simple representation of the nativity scene, the Spanish recreate the entire town of Bethlehem and its environs. Many families have a "belén box" that goes back decades, full of lovingly-collected half-broken figurines, lumps of papier-mâché, bits of twig and silver paper, mirrors, corks and dried grasses; all ingeniously employed to recreate streams and bridges, paths and hills, carpenter's forges, fields of wheat and so on.

El Caganer The custom of placing a crapping peasant / shepherd in the belén originated in Catalunya, but the universal love for all things scatological has led to its spread throughout the rest of Spain. No disrespect is meant by the defecating figurine. On the contrary, the idea is one of regeneration, i.e., of putting something back into the earth. The tradition dates back to the 18th century and has spawned a massive collectibles industry. Present elect Barack Obama is the latest in a long line of public figures to join the caganer hall of fame.

Eguberri The Basque word for Christmas means 'new day' and was probably used in pre-Christian times for the day of the winter solstice.

Jamón Christmas is a grim time for pigs, especially the patiently-fattened acorneating variety. One false turn in Carrefour and you'll find yourself suddenly hemmed in by ceilings of swinging forelegs and hind legs, interspersed with extra-large, extraphallic chorizos (sausages). Of all the festive foodstuffs it is the jamón, lovingly mounted on its cutting stand and covered with a damp

cloth, without which the Spanish Christmas hamper would never be complete.

Reyes Magos The names of their wizardly majesties are a bit of a mouthful, but are as familiar to the Spanish as Santa's reindeers are to fans of Rudolf the Red-nosed Reindeer, Melchor, Gaspar and Baltasar are said to represent Europe, Asia and Africa, respectively. There does seem to be some confusion, however, as to which one is which, and in some Three Kings processions it is Gaspar, rather than Baltasar who is the dark-skinned king. No matter, 'el rey negro' is always the favourite.


The play on words in the group's name reflects its openness to all comers.


New members are always welcome and in future we hope to work with local writers in other languages and with those in dance, painting or music.




