Restaurant Again

Spanish restaurant El Bulli, situated near Girona in Catalyuna and owned and run by Ferran Adria was for the third year running voted best restaurant in the world in the gala organised in London last week by the

gastronomic magazine Restaurant. Two other Spanish restaurants finished in the top ten.

VE Times to be Further Reduced

Trials are being carried out by the train company RENFE and the infrastructure administrator ADIF in order to further reduce the iourney times on AVE trains. An advanced safety and signalling system is being trialled so that the trains can reach speeds of up to 350 kph on certain stretches of track. The trials will continue gradually over many months but the final results may be limited by the lack of platforms at Madrid Atocha station. Already, times are frequently down to two and a quarter hours for the non stop Malaga to Madrid run, fifteen minutes less than scheduled.

on-Resident Sellers May Be Entitled to Tax

Non-residents of Spain who sold a property in this country between 2004 and the end of 2006 may be entitled to a 20% tax rebate from the Spanish Government. According to a Spanish law firm, foreigners who sold their Spanish properties before 2007 paid a Non Residents Income Tax rate of 35% on their capital gains, compared to a rate of 15% paid by Spanish residents. The law firm pointed out that this contravenes EU rules on discrimination and

was therefore improperly charged by the Spanish Government. A change in the law at the start of 2007 saw the standard Capital Gains Tax for non residents brought in line with residents at 15%. As a result, sellers who had previously sold property in Spain may be entitled to a 20% rebate.

panish Wealth Tax Abolished

The Spanish wealth tax, known in Spain as patrimonio (Impuesto sobre el Patrimonio), has been abolished by Spains socialist government, fulfilling an electoral promise made 4 years ago before the Socialists took power. The wealth tax has been abolished as of 01/01/2008, so the change does not affect tax declarations for the tax year 2007. For most non-resident property owners the tax bill for the wealth tax was never very big but for most owners will nevertheless be welcome at a time when municipal taxes, mortgage rates, and other overheads for property owners

are on the rise.

6 8 Eurovision Song Contest Result in Doubt

In a documentary TV this week.

aired on Spanish it was claimed Spain's win in the

1968 Eurovision Song Contest was won with 'bought' votes ordered by the dictator Francisco Franco. The song 'La La La' sung by Massiel beat Cliff Richard singing 'Congratulations' into second place.

ir Terry Wogan is questioning his Eurovision future after bloc voting handed the prize to the Russian entry.

With the British entry, Andy Abraham, finishing in joint

last place, Sir Terry expressed doubt that he would want to cover the event again, saying that it was "no longer a music contest".

No western European country has won the competition for eight years and the results of the 53rd contest, in Belgrade, Serbia, followed the same trend. Sir Terry said: "It's a disappointment, considering that Andy Abraham gave, I think, the performance of his life with a song that certainly deserved more marks than it got."

Referring to other songs in the competition, he added: "You have to say that this is no longer a music contest."

Perhaps most significantly, at least to fans of Sir Terry's trademark ironic commentary - to many people the only reason for watching the Eurovision farrago - he expressed uncertainty over whether he would be willing to get behind the microphone for next year's contest.

"I have to decide whether I want to do this again." he said.

"Western European participants have to decide whether they want to to take part from here on in, because their prospects are poor."

Later he issued a statement saying that his comments had been taken out of context, but video evidence shows otherwise. He added that he wanted to make it clear that he was never joking about the tragedy which was domestic violence

Spain to chang banking practices

The Bank of Spain is to join the Basel II agreement this year.

The banking system in Spain will this year adopt an international practice, known as the Basel II agreement, which will allow it to free up more assets, but will also see it penalised when it carried out high risk operations. It means that the banks will have to take greater care when granting a mortgage, and those of more than 95% of the value are expected to vanish from the market.

Each bank will now be obliged to offer greater transparency in a yearly report which explains the profile of their business and their exposition to risk.

Initially only a group of eight of Spain's largest banks will be approved by the Bank of Spain to take part in the scheme – Santander, BBVA, Banco Popular, Banco Sabadell, Bankinter, La Caixa, Caja Madrid and the Caixa Catalunya.

Spain arrests ten rip deal money launderers

Ten arrests have been made, five in Madrid and five in Barcelona.

The National Police in Spain has arrested ten people, five in Madrid and five in Barcelona, in two swoops against 'rip deal' swindlers. The gang pretended to be foreign investors with a great deal of money to spend, but used the ploy to defraud their victims.

The group swindled 450,000 € from one victim in Barcelona, and were arrested when they were trying to con another victim in Alicante.

Police investigations started when a property was

for sale in Calpe, valued at a million €, and two men, who called themselves Cristofel and Patrick, called the seller claiming to be foreign investors interested in making a purchase. The seller was suspicious and police then observed the later stages of the scam when he was offered

a high commission from the group for accepting different currencies and cash in small denomination notes.

Meetings to finalise the deal took place in both Madrid and Amsterdam with the final offer to the seller of the property for him to receive 700,000€ in 500€ notes and in return provide a reduced sum in 50 & 200€ notes. The deal was set for a Madrid hotel and police arrested a total of three men and two women from the gang. The 700,000€ turned out to be all in false 500€ notes.

# WASHING AWAY DISEASES THE

Health 101

■HE water and sanitation crisis does not grab headlines, but far more people suffer from it than what you would think," said Eveline Herfkens, UN general-secretary's



coordinator executive Millennium Development Goals campaign.

"While waterrelated diseases vary substantially in their nature. transmission, effects and management,

adverse health effected related to water are organized into four categories: water-borne, water-based, waterrelated vector, and water-scarce," explains Hinrichsen.

Water-borne diseases are "dirty water" diseases-those caused by water that has been contaminated human, animal. chemical

Worldwide, the lack of sanitary waste disposal and of clean water for drinking, cooking, and washing is to blame for over 12 million deaths a year.

Water-borne diseases include cholera, diarrhoea, typhoid. shigella, polio, meningitis, hepatitis A and E. Human beings and animals can act as hosts to the bacterial, viral, or



"Where proper sanitation facilities are lacking, water-borne diseases can spread Hinrichsen said. Untreated carrying excreta disease organisms wash or leach into freshwater sources, contaminating drinking water and food.

Water-based diseases are caused by aquatic organisms that spend part of their life cycle in the water and another part as parasites of animals. These organisms can thrive in either polluted or unpolluted water.

The parasitic worms enter the human body through contact with infested surface water, mainly among people engaged in agriculture and fishing. It has also been known to infect women who do their washing in parasite-infested rivers, or children who swim in them.

What is alarming is that cases of water-related vector



diseases are increasing. There are many reasons for this: people are developing resistance to drugs; mosquitoes are developing resistance to insecticides; environmental changes are creating new breeding sites; migration, climate change, and creation of new habitats mean that fewer people build up natural immunity to the disease; and many disease control programs have slowed or been abandoned.

Meanwhile, many other diseases--including trachoma, leprosy, tuberculosis, whooping cough, tetanus, and diphtheria--are considered water-scarce (also known as water-washed) in that they thrive in conditions where freshwater is scarce and sanitation is poor.

Infections are transmitted freshwater is available for washing hands.

According to the United Nations Environment Program (Unep), the incidence of water-related disease and death around the world could be cut by three quarters if there were adequate supplies of safe drinking water and adequate sanitation.

Water is, literally, the source of life on earth. The human body is 70 percent water. People begin to feel thirst after a loss of only one percent of bodily fluids and risk death if fluid loss nears 10 percent.

Cherry XIII Festival in Miravet 15 June




Sweet cherries are great just eating them as they are. However, we picked so much cherries that I have to bake something with them. I found this recipe which uses sweet cherries. It's a pudding cake. This pudding cake is so juicy that juices over run onto my oven. So, if you would like to attempt this recipe, use a bigger pan or put an aluminium foil lined baking sheet below your pan to catch the juices.

# Ingredients

- \* 3 cups cherries, pitted, thawed if frozen
- \* 1 teaspoon baking powder
- \* 1/4 teaspoon salt (necessary)
- \* 1 1/2 cups sugar, divided
- \* 1/2 cup milk
- \* 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
- \* 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- \* 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- \* 1 cup boiling water

I must say that the most tedious part of this recipe is pitting the cherries. Instructions



1.Place pitted cherries in the bottom of a buttered 9 inch square or 10 inch round cake pan or baking dish. I used a 7 x 11 baking dish (perhaps that's the reason the juices overrun).

- 2. Combine flour, baking powder, salt and half of the sugar in a mixing bowl.
- 3.Add milk, melted butter and vanilla. Beat until smooth.
- 4.Spread batter over cherries evenly.
- 5. Combine the remaining sugar and cornstarch in a small bowl.
- 6.Sprinkle sugar and cornstarch mixture over the batter. Pour the boiling water gently over the mixture.

7.Bake in a 350F preheated oven for 45 minutes or until a tester comes out clean when inserted in the center.

This Cherry Pudding Cake is great for breakfast or snack at tea break.

The lack of promotion of our own products is regrettable in a country like Catalonia. Look at the subject of the hazelnut from Tarragona... It is a variety only and exclusive to this zone, the sweetest and tastiest of all hazelnuts, and it is not really known here!

For this reason Miravet celebrates, on the third Sunday of June, the party of the cherry, where informative talks can be enjoyed, a sample "pomològica" with all rieties, a giant frying pan of paella with snails, etition of cherry cakes as well as a tasting of and cherry liqueur, even a curious competition nerry stone.

Miniature horses and miniature Appaloosas vary from 500 euros to 1,000 euros depending on sex, height and colours.



You can find their ranch in Aubachs near Flix, Tarragona with Miniature Horses and Miniature Appaloosas. They are very cute and pretty. Small children can ride the larger ones. They are lovely to have as pets as they love human company, and each has its own character. They can also be trained to pull small carts but most keep them just

They have 2 mares due to foal in in the summer and there were 2 foals born this April. This year they hope to have more foals for sale. They can also import from the UK and Holland. Visit their web site for photos when the foals arrive.

The stallion Ray of Light has good conformation and has won 3 first prizes in competitions in Holland. He is easy

to handle and well mannered both out and in.

This year they have a few for sale. If you want something special they can get it for you. Miniature horses are easy to look after. They do well on a saucepan full of alfalfa granules, oats and bran twice a day plus a wedge of alfalfa or rye grass hay. If you want to try breeding them yourself

it is better to have a larger mare than the stallion to avoid problems foaling.

All the miniature horses come with passports and microchips.

If you love horses there is nothing better than looking out of your window and seeing these lovely creatures grazing and

playing. One of the Falabella stallions from 1998 was bought by Spanish and takes part in the fiestas in



Tarragona and can do all the same tricks as the Andalusian horses.

Kelley whose contemporary style and experience comes from London and Brighton restaurants as well as 2 years here in Miami Platja at Carpe Diem and an Italian restaurant. Tarek has been here for 6 months and is a experienced chef from restaurants in London and has a classical approach to his menus. The 2 chefs in the family truly complement each other to provide a diverse A La Carte menu as well as traditional tapas, home-made Burgers and set menus. There are 2 lunch time menus for 8€ or 10€ which include home-made deserts. There is also a daily evening menu for 18€. The wine list was personally picked by the

family so they can help you to find a wine that suits your pallet.

There are special nights arranged, on 20th June there is a Rock 'n' Roll

evening and the previous successful Curry evening with home-made curries, chutneys & nan bread will be repeated on 7th June

They are open Tuesday to Sunday 10.00-15.30 and 19.00-22.30 which will be extended during summer months.



# 1) Barcelona's urban refugees

Joan and Gemma live in a small rented apartment in a trendy *barrio* of Barcelona, and have a three year old child.

While they love the city, Barcelona is increasingly noisy and polluted, and they long for a weekend country refuge that will eventually become their home. Their ideal is an old stone farmhouse of 90m2-180m2, with at least 2 hectares of land and water, in an attractive

inland location.

Mains electricity is not an issue: Joan and Gemma are committed to solar power and intend to be as self sufficient as possible. Major structural work is not an problem either, and they can spend up to 100.000 euros on the right property.

# 2) Sold up in UK, need to relocate fast

Mike and Sue have retired early and have already sold their house in the UK. Their children live here, and Mike and Sue were about to buy a *finca* with a house... which turned out to have been built illegally. Their funds are in Spain and they need to find something soon.

They are looking for at least 5.000 m2 of land with water and reasonable access, and a 2 or 3 bed house registered as a dwelling with no legality issues. They don't mind changing kitchens and bathrooms, but won't want to tackle major structural work.

Their budget is 250.000 euros, they don't need a mortgage and they can complete quickly.

# 3) Small country getaway retreats

Peter and Monica are a cosmopolitan Dutch/Catalan couple that have lived and worked on the Costa Dorada for some years.

They are attracted by the idea of a cosy country refuge for weekend breaks. Peter has worked refitting yacht interiors, and is looking forward to having a new project to keep him busy.

The couple want a finca with 10.000 m2 of land or more, with great mountain or sea views, about an hour's drive from Tarragona. 4x4 only access is not a problem, nor is overgrown land. Water is desirable.

A stone-built 'casita' of 40 or 50m2 would be ideal, and they expect to have to do some structural work.

Jordi and Marta live in an apartment in one of Barcelona's

many sprawling suburbs, and want a traditional 3 bed village house for weekends, which they plan to eventually retire to.

The house should be not more than 40 minutes from the sea and 2 hours from Barcelona, with natural light and some kind of outside space, like a terrace. While they expect to have to change kitchen and bathroom and do some reform work, they don't want a ruin.

Their budget is up to about 130.000 euros.

This is a small snapshot of the kind of buyers around right now. We are seeing relatively more enquiries from Holland, Belgium and Scandinavia, and interestingly, a surge in enquiries from Russian clients.

xpo 2008 is an international exposition planned

to be held from 14 June to 14 September 2008 coordinated by the Bureau of International Expositions, the organization that is responsible for sanctioning World's Fairs. The 2008 expo will be held in Zaragoza, Spain, with the topic of "Water and sustainable development". The event is being placed in a meander of the river Ebro.The exhibition's most emblematic buildings will be the Water Tower, a 80-metre-high transparent building designed by Enrique de Teresa to evoke a drop of water, Zaha Hadid's Bridge Pavilion and the river aquarium. The exposition site will also host several espectacles, including a daily parade by Cirque du Soleil called The Awakening of the Serpent.

Aside from the countries, non-government organizations and private companies will be taking part in Expo 2008, always with the idea of water and sustainable development. The Expo 2008 host committee has estimated that this event could generate 135 million euros in receipts for admission to the exhibition centre.

### Country pavilions

More than one hundred countries, plus dozens of companies and NGOs are expected to participate in Expo 2008.

### Citizen's initiative pavilion

This pavilion has the shape of a beacon, "a symbol of hope for the future of water in our world". It will express the vitality of ordinary people and non-governmental organisations. The Beacon will be situated by the Bridge Pavilion entrance.



### Shows

Expo 2008 will have a 93-day-long shows programme with more than 3,400 acts from more than 350 companies and artists.

On the expo site, there will be three shows called **Major events.** They are:

### Iceberg

This show will be the artistic part of the Opening Ceremony and it will be repeated each night. The Spanish director Calixto Bieito and the scenographer Alfons Flores are responsible for the set design while the music is by José Luis Romeo. About the show: It will be a poetic, beautiful, simple show but at the same time moving, ideally seen live but with a format and contents capable of being televised or transmitted by internet in real time. The central element of the show is a huge iceberg with a minute human figure standing before it (designed by the catalan company FOCUS)- mankind being both the main cause of climate change and its first victim. A dialogue of images and conflicts is established between the iceberg, the man and the Ebro that will guide us along a route mined by the wrongs that cause climate change and that will eventually lead us to the entreaty of a message of hope. It is a bid for a future where the decisiveness and will of mankind may create a new balanced relationship with nature

Zaragoza Pyrotechnics will provide the fireworks for the Night Show of Expo Zaragoza 2008 on the opening night.

• El hombre vertiente

This show is created by the Argentinean Pichón Baldinu. It will be repeated six times throughout the day on the thematic square Water inspirations. The public will experience extreme emotions.

### •The awakening of the serpent

The parade will be one of the great moments of the day. "The Awakening of the Serpent" will make its way every day. Its creative director is Jean François Brouchard while its artistic director is Julien Gabriel. The parade will also have water as its main theme. Cirque du Soleil will participate with acrobats, actors, gymnasts, singers and musicians.

The Expo 2008 mascot is Fluvi, a little male drop of water.

With his best friend Ica, the smallest drop of water, and Nico and Laurita, he will fight against the pollution made by Sec and Raspa, the evil Negas.

# After the Expo

The exposition site and its facilities have been planned thinking of their usage after the Expo finishes in September 2008 as a new extension of the city. Some of the buildings will be rented or

transferred to several institutions. This way, the Aragon Pavilion will be converted into the head office of a regional ministry, while the landmark buildings of the Expo, the Water Tower and the Bridge Pavilion, are expected to be purchased by local financial institutions.

The international pavilions will be remodelled and converted into offices so that the site becomes the main business park in Zaragoza. This space will also have establishments for leisure and restaurants.

A great part of the site may be used for shopping establishments and for the construction of a science park for businesses.

# 19TH INTERNATIONAL FIREWORKS DISPLAY COMPETITION IN "CIUTAT DE TARRAGONA" 7TH TO 12TH JULY

Mediterranean area is held every first week of July in Tarragona, in Catalonia, Spain, in a wonderful bay -Punta del Miracle-, a place praised by the famous architect Antoni Gaudí. The selector board, formed by people appointed by the City Council of Tarragona, selects six international pyrotechnic companies every year. Then the order of shooting is decided through a draw. The fireworks are both aerial and aquatic.

The jury is usually formed by sixteen international members chaired by the Lord Mayor. The jury mainly takes into account the occupation of the air space; purity, intensity, brightness and duration


of the colours; the chromatic variety, luminosity, dimensions, form designs, elegance, diversity of effects, sonority, conjunction with the environment, originality, rhythm, the plan of the performance, the starting, the final crescendo and acceptance by the public.

Since 1990 very important companies from all over the world have fired in the Tarragona Contest: Ricardo Caballer, Vicente Caballer and Turís from Valencia; Pirogestión and Igual from Catalonia; Astondoa from Basque country; Francesco Pagano, Martarello, La Rosa Lorenzo and Orzella from Italy; Lidu and China Panda from China; Marutamaya and Tamaya from Japan; Gamma P from Germany; and Foti from Australia.

Daily sixty thousand people see every display, and a lot of pyrotechnicians come to Tarragona to buy new products. The winner gets the first prize and also fires the fireworks display at the Santa Tecla Festival, one of the most important Spanish traditional festivals, between 15th and 24th September. It has been celebrated since 1321 and it has been considered of national touristic interest by the Spanish government. # WORRIED ABOUT CHOLESTEROL?



ee how the right diet can help stave off heart

You hear so many stories these days about diet, cholesterol and heart disease that you could easily be 'frightened to death'. NHS registered Dietitians at Eatatease.com help unravel the tales from the truth with clear, sound advice.

Diet and coronary heart disease The food we eat affects our health both directly and indirectly in lots of ways. There is, for instance, a direct relationship between diet and heart problems, so having the wrong eating habits can help increase the risk of heart disease and even stroke through contributing factors such as cholesterol, blood pressure, blood clotting and body weight.

Like most of these factors, cholesterol only becomes a



problem when its concentrations in the blood are too high. Although it is a fatty substance, this in itself is not a problem, as the body actually needs a certain amount of it - producing some itself and absorbing the rest from animal foods such as dairy products, eggs and meat.

Cholesterol is carried around the body in the blood, where it is attached to a protein in a fat-protein combination known as a lipoprotein. These are categorised as high density (HDL), low density (LDL) or very low density (VLDL), depending on the amount of protein in relation to the fat.

It doesn't take an Einstein to work out that it's the low and very low-density lipoproteins that can cause serious damage to our coronary system if they become

too highly concentrated in the blood, adding to blood pressure and blood clotting, while a good level of HDLs actually helps to combat cholesterol build-up in the TRANS FATS &

To further complicate matters there is another type of fat to look out for: triglyceride's. Triglyceride's are derived from calories that are stored up in fat cells, theoretically as a reserve for later use. Although most are stored in fat tissue, low levels are also found in the blood, where they work with VDLs to increase the risk of heart disease.

How do you know if your cholesterol is high? High cholesterol itself does not cause any symptoms, so many people are unaware that their cholesterol levels are high. The only way to know if you have high cholesterol is by a blood test.

### Foods that 'build' cholesterol

Avoid a high intake of saturated fats, found mainly in animal products such as lard, butter, cream and hard cheese. These foods are fine in moderation, but can contribute significantly to cholesterol levels, so try to keep to an occasional treat, limit to a 2-4 times a week.

Limit cholesterol-rich foods such as prawns, fish roe and offal (kidneys, liver etc.) to no more than once every two weeks and eggs to no more than 3-4 times a week. Egg white contains no cholesterol and can replace yolks. Substitute two whites for one egg

Reduce your intake of salt and sugar-based products such as cakes and sweets, and greasy foods such as chips, chorizo, pies and anything fried in oil. If you enjoy these foods, treat yourself once a week.

Remember, all fats are high in calories and will create fat pockets that are unsightly, unhealthy and will strain your heart and other organs, so moderate your intake of fatty foods, watch

your weight and exercise. It need not be a strenuous programme: just get off the sofa and make sure you


### Foods that help prevent cholesterol build-up

We can't avoid consuming fat altogether, nor would it be healthy to, so make sure you choose healthier fats such as mono unsaturated fats like those found in olive oil. olive oil spreads and rapeseed oil, as they give us the fat content we need without building up HDL levels.

Polyunsaturated fats, such as those in vegetables and seeds like sunflower, soya, maize and fish oil are good in moderation. The omega-3 contained in oily fish such as mackerel, sardines, kippers, salmon, trout and fresh tuna are excellent in combating heart disease, so try to have a portion at least twice a week.

Fibre helps to break down cholesterol, hence the doctor's advice to eat at least five portions of fruit and vegetables a day, but these and other fibre-rich foods like beans and oats will also give you a healthy, natural energy boost.

Fats are less likely to build up in your arteries or as unsightly belts on your body if you burn them up through exercise. Again, the amount of exercise should be in proportion to your fitness levels, so it's better to do little often than try being overly ambitious only to give up shortly afterwards. For those not keen on physical exercise or sport just walking is a relaxing but healthy way to keep fit.



# DRIVING IN SPAIN BY CHRIS DANN THE



hen driving around the roads of Spain you should be aware that you need to change the way you think and react in order to fit in with the different standards and values of the people round you. To that end I thought a few rules and regulations that the average driver may not be aware of might come in handy.

When driving a Spanish registered car in Spain you must always carry with you the original copy of;

Driving licence • Permiso de Circulación • Fichas Technicas • Proof that Impuestos de Circulación (road tax) has been paid • Valid insurance documents • Current ITV (If the car needs one) • Tarjeta de Residencia or your NIE number and a photocopy of your passport

You must also carry;

High visibility jacket (inside the car, not in the boot). Two warning triangles • Spare set of bulbs (and, technically, the means to change them) . Spare wheel and the means to change it • Spare glasses if you need them for driving.

Failure to provide any one of the above will result in an 'on the spot' fine However, when you get up to six they will probably impound the car and you will be walking home !!

When driving a UK registered car you must display a current UK tax disc, and be in possession of a current, valid MOT and insurance from the country of registration. You should also be in possession of your driving licence and a photocopy of your passport.

A Spanish ITV is not valid on a UK registered vehicle.



Remember, only drive a UK registered vehicle on Spanish roads for up to six months. After that it must return to the UK for a full, continuous six month period or be re-registered with Spanish national plates. You cannot take it back to the UK, tax, MOT and insure it and then return in two

Incorrect documentation would mean that your insurance company would, almost certainly, void your insurance.

It is illegal to use a mobile phone while driving (150 euro fine and three points).

A stop sign in Spain means stop. You cannot roll over if there is nothing coming. You must bring the car to a complete stop. (150 euro fine and three points).

You cannot make a left turn on a national road across an unbroken white line. (150 euro fine, three points and a 40 ton lorry in your boot!)

The use of a radar detector is illegal. The traffic police can detect the use of one and will impound your car while they remove it.

Overtaking on the right on a dual carriageway, Autopista/ Autovia, is illegal. (150 euro fine and three points).

When overtaking on a dual carriageway or Autopista/ Autovia ,the use of the left indicator is compulsory. When pulling back in the use of the right indicator is also compulsory.

Failure to do so will result in a 100 euro fine and two points.

The wearing of seat belts, both front and rear, is compulsory at all times.

Motorcyclists must wear a crash helmet at all times and drive with the head light on dipped beam during daylight hours.



Children under twelve are not allowed in the front seat of a car unless suitably restrained by an approved device.

Dogs must be restrained at all times with an approved device when travelling in a car.

Spanish driving schools tend to teach their pupils to come to a stop on a slip road and wait for a gap in the traffic. Try and remember that next time you're accelerating along a slip road into a gap in the traffic on a national road with your eyes fixed on your overtaking mirror.

Many Spanish driving schools teach their pupils to 'touch park'. This means that they will reverse into a space and keep going until they make contact with the car behind. That is their signal

to select first gear. It's quite acceptable and perfectly normal.

The Drink Drive laws in Spain are rigorously enforced and the level is lower than in the UK (0.05 as opposed to 0.08). If you are ever caught Drinking and Driving the penalties are harsh. Anything from a heavy fine and your car being impounded up to imprisonment! My advice. Don't even think about it!

# COMMON COMPUTER PROBLEMS

# Windows

My PC has stopped responding! What do I do?

If a program or window on your PC seems to have frozen up and you cannot close it by clicking the X (Close) button in the top-right corner, hold down the CTRL and ALT keys together and tap DELETE once.

In Windows Task Manager click on Applications which shows all the programs that are currently running. You can usually tell which program has frozen or crashed as its Status will appear as Not responding. Click to highlight that program on the list then click on End Task. The PC will now attempt to close it. If it is successful you can then close Task Manager and the PC should be able to carry on as normal.

If Task Manager does not appear, try holding down CTRL, ALT and DELETE and keeping all three keys held. This will restart your PC, which will often fix the problem. If these keys don't work, you will have to press and hold the power switch or turn the plug off. Turn the PC back on. Your PC should be alright but always try to avoid switching off without shutting down properly first.

# File won't open

Sometimes when you double-click a file, nothing happens or the program that is usually used to open that type of file can't run it. Instead, right-click the file and use Open With.. to choose a different program to try to open it with. I'm running out of disk space.

I have deleted a file by mistake! What can I do?

First check the Recycle Bin on your Desktop to see if it



is in there. Deleted documents go there first, so if you find it there and want to put it back where it was, rightclick it and select Restore.

Once items are deleted from the Recycle Bin you will need special software to retrieve them, such as Recover My Files.

I can't find a particular file or folder but I know it's on my PC somewhere!

Click on the Start menu and Search all files and folders.

Type in the name of the missing file or folder and
Windows will try to find it.

I can't see any system files or folders! Where are they?

Important system files and folders are usually hidden to prevent accidental deletion. They still exist but will not be visible.

To see them, open any folder and click on Tools then Folder Options. Click on the View tab and under the Advanced Settings list tick Show hidden files and folders. Also un-tick Hide protected operating system files. Now click OK.
