U Law Forces Airlines to Show Full Prices. The law which obliges airline companies to show full prices including taxes and other charges has been ratified by the EU and will come into force at the end of this year.

egional Languages Confuse Visitors. The increasing use of regional languages in Spain is causing confusion among visitors according to tourism bosses. Languages such as Catalan in the northeast and the Balearics, Basque in Pais Vasco and Navarra, and Galician in the northwest are even replacing Castilian Spanish on road signs and notice boards. The issue is a sensitive one for the Government since the languages were suppressed during the thirty vears of Franco rule.

The port of Cork, already in talks with ferry operators, is seeking EU financial assistance for a proposed ferry service from Cork to Gijon in northwest Spain. The proposed freight and passenger service would run three times per week and take about 24 hours for the crossing

> our Airlines Denounced by Consumer Organisation.

The consumer organisation FACUA has denounced low-

cost airlines Clickair, Vueling, Ryanair and Easyjet for charging customers for baggage following a study on eighteen companies regarding tariffs for excess baggage. It has also criticised Ryanair for charging for the mere fact of checking in at the airport. The report has been sent to the relevant government departments for consideration.

oints System Reduces Accidents. A report by a motoring organisation, RACC, has announced a large decrease in accidents which they attribute to the introduction of the points system on driving licences in Spain. Figures show 800 deaths less on the road in 2007 compared to 2005 and a reduction of 23% in accidents involving cars. Figures involving coaches and articulated vehicles were down by 45% and 55%, but on the negative side, those involving lorries, motor bikes and bicycles were up by 42%, 32% and 17%.

The mystery of some crop circles which have appeared in Vacarisses in Barcelona has been solved.



The owner of the land, Ignasi Gibert, has now revealed that the circles have nothing to do with aliens, but were created for the filming of a beer commercial made at

the end of last month. He said it took a team of ten people some five hours to make the design.

The Mayor of Vacarisses said the circles, next to the C-16 motorway, have created a great deal of interest and have been featured on many internet sites and in paranormal magazines.




oa Constrictor Captured. Malaga recaptured a one and a half metre boa constrictor which fell from a fourth floor apartment on to a car then to the pavement. The creature, which was apparently slightly stunned but otherwise unhurt, was returned to its owner.

4.000 Euros for the loss of a testicle A Barcelona man has been paid compensation after a misdiagnosis by the Catalan Health Service.

A 22 year old man from Barcelona is to get 54,890 € in compensation from the Catalan Health Service after he lost a testicle. The man was suffering from a twisted testicle which was not diagnosed in time by doctors when he was 20 years old.

The man, named with the initials M.M.C. had gone for treatment in November 2006 suffering from pain and inflammation, but the Patients' Defender has

concluded he received inadequate treatment when an infection was diagnosed. Two days later he returned to the Viladecans Hospital emergency department where the correct diagnoses was then made, but by this time a lack of blood flow meant that one testicle had to be



in Spain. By h.b. - Jul 18, 2008. Both airlines are keeping planes on the tarmac and have announced cut backs at Spanish airports.

The high price of aviation fuel has lead to a cut back in operations in Spain from two low-cost airlines.

Spanair has decided that only Madrid and Barcelona will be future bases for its flights. As the airline outlines planned cutbacks as part of a viability plan in these days of high oil prices, it has become clear that the other bases of Spanair at Palma, Málaga, Tenerife, Bilbao and Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, will all lose that category. It means a centralisation of pilots, cabin staff and mechanics in the company.

Staff cuts of 1,100, some 29% of the workforce were announced earlier this week. The airline is also going

to leave nine of its planes on the ground during September and October.

The unions in Spanair have asked the company that the redundancies that they want to make take the form of early retirement and for those workers who want to leave. They warn that they will start demonstrations of they detect any other company interest apart than the future viability of the company.



Ryanair has also given details of its cutbacks because of the increased fuel prices the suspension of their services in Palma and Valencia as part of a

14% cutback in flights. Flights to another five Spanish destinations are also set to be suspended between November 4 and December 19.

Ryanair Chairman, Michael O'Leary, said that airport charges and the massive increase facing the company in fuel prices made it more profitable for Ryanair to leave planes on the ground during the time.

The court in Tarragona heard how the accused, 19 year old Luigi D.G. killed the 11 month old baby because the child distracted him and forced him to lose a game of 'Mortal Kombat'.

It happened last September in his home in Reus, Barcelona.



UMMER TIME BLUES

"Summer is here and with it vacations for us and our families. The decision of where to go is often complicated when it is not possible or practical to take our animals along. We are faced with the dilemma of what to do with them. Those horse owners whose animals are stabled with qualified attendants know that the best solution is to leave them there. Leaving our dogs and cats at home, also the best for them, is not often easy to arrange. Even if they do not have special needs, someone coming around daily may not be able to provide sufficient care and/or attention. It is at times like these that other avenues need to be explored, a house sitter is one possibility, but the



cages and runs - indoors/outdoors, covered? Is there enough room for them to get proper exercise? Are they made of material easily cleaned and disinfected? What kind of insect control measures are employed? How often are they fed and watered? Are there grooming facilities available? What are their contingency plans in case of a veterinary emergency? Do they have any prerequisites, i.e. vaccinations or reservations? For your pets protection their vaccinations should be current- within the last year, if not they should have a booster prior to entering a kennel.

If your plans include your animals then there are



other considerations to be aware of for those hikes in the hills or jaunts on the beach. All that glitters is not gold and with this heat be aware of the threats from ectoparasites - fleas, ticks. mosquitoes and biting flies. The



clipping down, very short as opposed to thinning out, of long haired breeds of dogs and cats does not necessarily make them cooler; it may on the contrary make them more susceptible to the heat. It certainly

makes them more available to the many biting pests (fleas, ticks. mosquitoes, sand-fly, horse-fly other biting flies) we all confront, more abundant in the warmer weather. They do not have



sweat glands in their skin, panting is one of the most

methods common they rely upon to control their body temperature.

That fur coat could be helping insulating somewhat against the sun. A dog pants when it is hot as a means of controlling body temperature, sweating, likewise it does not



always mean that they are thirsty.

There are many types of weeds and dry plant seeds that stick to fur and can cause all sorts of problems between the toes, up the nose, down the ear, or in the

If a dip in the sea or the pool is in order remember that we rinse the salt water or chlorine off afterwards, it follows then that our animals get the same treatment. This may help in reducing the all too frequent hot spots or summer eczemas. Over shampooing, even with the mildest of medicated shampoos may cause skin problems rather than resolving them. Make sure in the heat that they have abundant water available and a shady spot to take refuge in. If the water isn't fit for us to drink we ought to be giving our animals the same bottled water we use. Keeping these few things in mind should make for a more relaxed vacation for

all concerned. HE HEAT IS ON



Summer is almost upon us and with it we should be aware of potential dangers, besides the heat, our animals may have to confront. They should, of course, have abundant cool water, ventilation and shade available. Beware of running them free on the beaches as there is also an increase of discarded fish hooks which the dogs w/out muzzles could encounter when scavenging. If your pet gets hooked do not cut the fishing line, it could help to locate the hook. This time of year has also been known as a time when there is an increase in the loss of disoriented vacationing pets or the abandonment of pets, when it is time for the family vacation.

Private non-profit Animal Protective Societies are found scattered around our area. It was pointed out once that in the U.K. and the States these societies exist out of a need to correct conscious acts of cruelty, while in Spain much of what has gone on was out of lack of knowledge



agrarian society where pets were rarely kept except by some big city dwellers. There has been a rapid evolution of attitudes with regards to animal welfare, which can be witnessed in the media, just by seeing the animal related advertisements in the print media or on Spanish Television, as well as programs with segments on pet care or entire programs about pets and animal welfare. There have been recent laws passed, on a national and regional level, regarding animal rights and responsible ownership of all domestic animals. What needs to be done now is that pressure needs to be applied on the local police and town councils for compliance with these new statutes on the books. The more pressure applied by the public the sooner the townships will realize that it is in their interest to comply. Towns are required to have at least some public shelter/housing facilities available for abused and/or strays, including emergency care if they are injured. In the recent elections, promises were made - again - to create such facilities, long overdue and still non-existent. Some towns have agreements with local non-profit protective rescue societies. Whatever the case may be, these organisations serve an important function providing a very necessary and commendable service. They need all the help and support that we can give them, so if you wish to help them out they are always in need of funds and volunteers.








Gain faster access to your drives, printers, programs, etc., by customizing your "Send To" menu

You can easily send files to floppy drives, printers, briefcases, and certain Windows programs by right clicking on it and selecting a destination from "Send To" menu. But, did you know that it's possible to add almost any kind of device and/or program to the "Send To" menu to make it easier to transfer files to most frequently used destinations?

- 1. Run Windows Explorer.
- Select your Windows directory (C:\Windows for example).
- If you're running Windows 95, select "SendTo" folder.

If you're running Windows NT, select "Profiles\
Default User\SendTo" folder.

- 3. Now, simply create shortcuts inside the SendTo folder as usual to the devices and programs you want to have access to from the "SendTo" menu. For example, to add your WORK folder on your zip drive (D:\Work for example) to the SendTo menu:
- * Right click inside the SendTo folder and select "New | Shortcut"
- * Type "D:\Work" without the quotes and click on "Next"
- * Type a name for the newly created SendTo item ("My Work Folder" for example) and click on "Finish" Now when you right click on files, you'll see "My Work Folder" appear as an option in the SendTo menu.

TOO MANY FOLDERS?

By default Windows will open a new window every time you click on a folder icon / shortcut. If this



makes your desktop harder to manage, you can ask Windows to keep using the same folder window to display folders.

- * Open "My Computer" folder
- * Select "View | Options..."
- * Change to the "Folder" tab
- * Select "Browse folders by using a single window that changes as you open each folder"
- * Click on "OK"

WHO'S CONNECTED TO YOU?

If you're running any TCP/IP services (such as WWW service, FTP service, POP3/SMTP services, or even just NetBIOS over TCP/IP) on your computer, you may want to find out who's connected to your computer and from where at a given time. This information is easy to obtain using NETSTAT command.

- * Go to the "DOS Prompt" or "Command Prompt"
- * Type

NETSTAT < number of seconds>

For example, if you want to redisplay the TCP/IP connections every 10 seconds, type:

NFTSTAT 10

* Press ENTER

RACTICAL GARDENING

The Mediterranean coast and inland valleys and mountainsides are in general wonderful places to live and garden. The generally benign climate, the wonderful native plants and imported subtropical plants make gardening and al fresco meals and siestas possible on most days of the year. But there are risks! Many face the challenge of poor shallow rocky soils and everyone can expect maximum and minimum temperatures well above and below those communicated by many tourist boards and real estate agents and the occasional shocks of monsoon rains and summer hail storms. We once had 68 centimetres of rain in a day of which 24 fell in an hour resulting in some nearby thousand year old terraces being damaged for the first time. Last night we had for the first time in twenty years 15 minutes of tennis ball sized hail stones that have decimated our 150 tomato plants, climbing beans, squashes and raspberries. Those who were in Spain in February 2005 will remember the worst frosts for 50 years that affected gardens from the Pyrenees to Gibraltar. Ours was blackened but now that plants have recovered one would not know that such things can happen.

Having faced such challenges ourselves and learned much the hard way we are happy to help the readers of The Olive Tree though monthly articles and our books*. Month by month we will look at seasonal topics related to the herb, flower, fruit and vegetable gardens as week as the benefits of livestock if you have space. Being now August ask yourselves how well your garden has enabled you to live a relaxed outdoor lifestyle and list the changes you need to make during the autumn and winter. edible and add a bit of a crunch to the overall texture. Pomegranates store extremely well in a cool dry place and continue to sweeten off the tree. The plant itself is very hardy and highly ornamental, it has large showy flowers and is suitable for use as a feature plant, for hedges and container growing. Pomegranite shrubs can

also makes an attractive and interesting bonsai specimen. A shrub or small tree to about 4 m, the pomegranate is multi stemmed, spiny and extremely long lived. Plants are usually pruned to form a short but well defined trunk allowing 4 or 5 shoots to develop into a multi branched form. Pomegranate is not fussy about soil condition, in its native environment in Northern India and Iran it is found growing in rocky gravel.

Pomegranates can be slow to get established in heavy soils. They respond well to pruning and regular high nitrogen feedings after flowering and fruiting are finished. Hand pollination of flowers helps cropping. Always keep them moist and plant somewhere in full sun. During the winter months, when the tree is dormant, prune it to shape and remove growth that goes straight up, to encourage the round, open canopy that will produce the most fruit.

Pomegranates are relatively easy to grow. They are not expensive to buy and produce many fruits. They reportedly contain up to 3 times more antioxidants than any other fruit. Antioxidants are the naturally occurring

substances that quench the body of free radicals, therefore protecting vital tissues from damage. The fruit contains polyphenols, tannins and anthocyanins - all compounds that could have beneficial effects. Packed with Vitamins A, C, E and Iron, the pomegranate fruit has been cultivated since pre-historic times.

ace it: odds are you're never going to learn to speak much Spanish or Catalan just by hanging around in bars and asking for cafés con leche or cervezas. For

anyone except small children, learning a foreign language requires determined effort and hard work.

And as everyone knows, practice is one of the keys to getting a working grasp of any language. But if you live here already you have a huge advantage, especially if you have time on your hands, so here are a few proven ideas to help you kick-start your Spanish or Catalan:

1.- Shopping: ¿el último, por favor?

Forget the supermarket: if you want to learn, personal interaction is the name of the game. If you have time, buy your fresh fruit and veg, meat, fish, bread, etc in small shops where you have to ask for what you want. While you may pay a bit more, the produce is often fresher than in your local *supermercat*. Gradually you'll improve your vocabulary, especially if you go every day.

Tip: to ask in Spanish, who is the last in the queue, say 'el último, por favor?' in a questioning tone.

SEVEN TIPS TO HELP YOU LEARN SPANISH OR CATALAN

2.- Exchange classes

While Catalan classes —some of them free— for adults are more widely available, it's not that easy to find Spanish classes for foreigners outside of major towns. An alternative is to find someone local that wants to improve his or her English conversation skills in return for helping you get started with Catalan or Spanish. Local school teachers are ideal.

Tip: little and often is best. Classes of over an hour and a half are best avoided as they can be very tiring.

3.- Reading and writing exercises

Even if your aim is mainly to be able to speak and understand basic Spanish or Catalan, it's vital to back up speaking and listening with some written work and reading comprehension. You'll find a little time spent studying every day will reinforce your knowledge and help you achieve your goal.

Important: when buying a Spanish textbook online, make sure it's for European Spanish, not Latin American Spanish.

4.- The Sky is the limit...

OK, Spanish TV can admittedly be pretty dire, although the Catalan channels are (in my opinion) better. But that said,



they can definitely help you learn the language, so ignore the howls of protest from your teenage kids and stop watching English satellite TV today...

Tip: start by watching the daily news and weather.

5.- Read a little every day

Join your local public library (biblioteca pública) —see the menu options in http://www20.gencat.cat/portal/site/Biblioteques for a complete list— and start reading, even though you won't understand every word. I'd recommend short stories and best-sellers and detective stories, the kind of thing with that you can't put down. Books translated from English are good too, and some people find children's books helpful.

Tip: get into the habit of reading the local paper every day.

6.- Go the cinema

Once you can follow a conversation to some degree, watching Spanish films at the cinema is a great way to hone your listening skills. Films here are almost always dubbed, with 95% in Spanish rather than in Catalan. Dialogue is usually clear, simple and well-pronounced, and being in a cinema seems to somehow focus your attention far better than watching a film at home.

Tip: most cinemas have one day a week —often a Wednesday— when it's cheaper to get in, known as the 'día del espectador'.

7.- Pronunciation and confidence

It's worth making a special effort with regard to

pronunciation

While it may be possible to speak English without moving your lips very much at all, to communicate effectively in Spanish or Catalan you'll need to

recreate their vowel and consonant sounds as closely as you can. See http://www.lingolex.com/pronounce for a very simple guide to Spanish pronunciation.

Lastly, anyone learning a language naturally makes mistakes, and one of the biggest barriers is to overcome our natural fear of making fools of ourselves. Some years back I startled the ladies in the local butchers' shop with a request for a little tenderness —ternura— when what I wanted was some beef —ternera!

Luckily the Catalans are pretty patient with foreigners and will usually help if you make an effort to speak Spanish, and more especially, Catalan. So stick with it and try to immerse yourself in the language as much as you can: you'll be glad you did.



n an average day, Gracia is a peaceful residentialy neighbourhood north of the city centre, with narrow streets lined with elegant old balconied buildings and shady squares



with historic churches and cafe terraces. But for one week in August, everything changes. When the week-long Festa Major takes over Gracia on August 15th, tranquillity goes out of the window, replaced by the Catalans' typically exuberant taste music and mass celebration in the streets.

The Gràcia Fest is basically a hyperbole of a block party - events and feasts are scheduled all throughout the day, live music persists

every night until dawn, and outdoor bars and their patrons make it

impossible to cross even the smallest square in under ten minutes. Every year, over a million people flood the



narrow streets

of Gràcia to gawk and to party until literally flushed out by street cleaners in the morning.

ating back to the early 19th century, it has become one of Barcelona's biggest festivals, which is saying something for a city that can practically count the year's nonfiesta days on the fingers one hand. And it sees Gracia residents from 23 neighbouring streets competing for the prize for best-decorated street, by doing innovative things with plastic, cardboard, wood and any other materials they can lay their hands on, set around a different theme each year. Designs range from the beautiful to the surreal and in all cases are highly elaborate. You are advised to admire their artwork early on the 15th as from then on everything starts to deteriorate as the carnival atmosphere takes over.

Taulet, with a parade of giant carnival figures and And perhaps the most impressive spectacle of the entire festival is the performance of the Castellers, teams of Catalans who form human towers up to nine or ten people tall as a demonstration

of cultural unity and strength. In short, there is certainly not a lack of things to do during the festival. and benches to accommodate the influx of a million visitors from throughout the city and abroad and on that first evening at 7pm there is a parade of characters from Catalan folklore. To fuel the atmosphere, live bands take root in different spots around Gracia - prime positions are to be found in Plaza del Sol - to play as long and loudly as possible. Like any festival worth its salt, there are loads of food stalls and many local bars open onto the streets to provide endless liquid sustinence.

betting the sense of the fantastical, while wandering through these worlds, one runs the risk of stumbling into a magic show for toddlers conducted in Catalan, or the possibility of intruding on a parade thrown by local anarchists.

During the day, tourists explore these streets with festival programs stuffed in their back pockets, and small children waddle under paper-mâché decorations as their parents chase them with cameras.

hen night falls and the streets jam, toddlers are promoted to shoulder seating, and the scene takes on a decidedly more adult

tenor. Crushes of people drink and dance, and when the bands stop playing, crowds congregate around

impromptu musicians and refuse to go home until the Guardia Civil politely suggests otherwise. For

those who live in Gràcia, it is understood that the week will be a sleepless one- restaurants and bars offer specials on mojitos and capirinhias, and even serve them directly out of windows so as to avoid the trouble of forcing people to abandon the street.



(don't expect them to be going to bed anytime before 2am), cultural activities and dancing. When you see devils running down the street and setting off fireworks you know the end is

in site with the spectacular closing ceremony, the 'correfoc'. and Gracia returns to its usual summer sleepiness.

If there is one thing that the British cannot handle it's making a complaint about the food they have been served in restaurants. Even if the food is indescribably bad when the waiter comes round and says "everything all right for you, Sir?" your true Brit will nod enthusiastically and thank them for their efforts.



Whenever we leave the Country of our birth the natives always seem to be capable of rustling up a more than adequate meal from a few simple fresh ingredients without causing a digestion crisis. What is more the resulting concoction usually tastes of something.

I bring this matter up because I recently had the misfortune to dine, hardly the word, in an English pub. With some friends, we decided to take advantage of some simple pub fare. Nothing too complicated, just a burger with salad and chips. The salad looked OK; there is nothing much you can do to mess up a bit of lettuce and a tomato. The chips looked like the regular pre-cut, frozen jobs we expect and the bun seemed harmless enough. As for the burger, well let's say it bore no indication that it had ever stood in a field and moo'd at any time. It was a perfectly circular object absolutely uniform in consistency with a sort of greyish black appearance.

Undaunted we put our knives to this object. A basic knife did not really seem up to the task. After a bit of judicious

> sawing one managed to hack off a bit of this questionable substance. The taste, and I'm being generous here, was akin

CORRESPONDENT (NORFOLK) to a section of tramps boot. I can only describe it as chewy, with a hint of indefinable meatiness. Even burgers prepared by an organisation that declares we are "Lovin' it" do, apparently, have a fair amount of bovine material in them even it is from the less choice cuts of the animal concerned and predominantly uses bits that dangle. This object did not fall into even that category. In fact a tramp's footwear would probably be a bit more digestible.

Still it pays to diversify and people obviously don't complain much







Insect bites leave venom in the skin and cause a usually mild but itchy skin reaction. Scratching may infect the wound and leave lasting scars. Infection becomes obvious if the bite swells and reddens on the second day or after the initial skin reaction seemed to improve. Some people react to bites with allergic rashes, which can be dangerous if the swelling blocks air passages. Insect bites are also a serious problem if the insect carries disease. In several tropical regions, mosquitoes carrying malaria cause dangerously high fevers. In some wild areas of North America, tick bites may cause Lyme disease and Rocky Mountain spotted fever. Since tick bites are not painful, they can easily be overlooked. Lyme disease causes flu-like symptoms to develop within one month of the tick bite, often with a rash.

Weeks later, it can cause lingering arthritis, heart problems, neuritis and other nervous system disorders, which usually go away after several months. In rare cases, symptoms last indefinitely. Rocky Mountain spotted fever causes a dangerously high fever, headaches, muscle pains and a rash. These symptoms develop within two weeks of a tick bite. Other biting insects are horseflies, ants, fleas, lice and scabies mites. None of these carry diseases, though they can be troublesome.

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) Causes

Mosquito and tick bites can be prevented with sufficient clothing. Insects prefer dark clothing and bright floral designs to pastel colours and whites. Sweet, flowery perfumes, hairsprays and sun-screens also attract mosquitoes and other insects. In hot climates, mosquito nets help, especially near water and after sunset, when mosquitoes are most prevalent. Natural insect repellents including garlic and cider vinegar (diluted chlorine) will help. Alcohol dilates the blood vessels in the skin, which attracts insects, including mosquitoes and horseflies. Ticks thrive in wooded areas, so wearing adequate clothing helps to repel them. Since the bites are painless, checking for ticks after a day in the woods can help prevent infection.

> Household pets are often a source of fleas and ticks, and can also carry worms. Head lice are passed on among

children very quickly regardless of hygiene, so head lice are difficult to avoid. Body and pubic lice are less easily contracted, since they are spread through contaminated clothing and sexual contact.

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) Nutrition

To prevent bites from mosquitoes and horseflies, avoid alcohol, Alcohol causes the skin to flush and the blood vessels to dilate. attracting insects. Eating garlic or rubbing it on the skin helps repel insects. Yeast also helps reduce susceptibility to bites. Eat nutritional

yeast daily for three weeks before going into the woods to discourage mosquitoes and black flies from biting. After a severe insect bite, drink plenty of pure spring water, light soups and diluted juices to flush out residual toxins.

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) Nutritional **Supplements**

As a prevention for insect bites, garlic and vitamin B1 (thiamine) supplements are effective, as they give off an unfavourable scent to the insect. A vitamin B complex can be added to B1 for several weeks to prevent imbalances. Use brewer's yeast supplements for pets, or nutritional yeast for humans. Garlic is more effective against ticks. Take these supplements several days before and throughout a trip to wooded, damp areas.

Very high doses of vitamin C, taken together with calcium, can be used effectively to combat the allergic and toxic effects of all kinds of bites, even against venomous spiders and snakes. The calcium also seems to markedly reduce the

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) **Herbal Remedies**



Herbal remedies can promote healing of the skin, decrease inflammation, help the body cleanse residual toxins from the blood and boost the immune system.

- Yarrow reduces the itching and swelling, while lemon balm, plantain and ivy Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks leaves soothe and heal. Crush or gently rub & Fleas) External/Physical leaves on the bite.

To boost the immune system and purify the blood, take • 10to20 drops of echinacea tincture in liquid or 1to2 capsules or tablets three times daily for up to a week. After the venom is removed and the bite thoroughly cleaned • and disinfected, apply comfrey and plaintain salve to speed healing. Make sure all traces of venom have been removed from the area before applying comfrey, as this herb almost instantly rebuilds tissue over the area.

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) Homeopathy

Homeopathic remedies are excellent for insect stings and bite reactions or pain. The recommended dosage is 2 tablets under the tongue in a 6c strength, repeating every fifteen minutes for three doses. If symptoms persist, repeat every four hours for an extra day or two. Stop once symptoms improve.

- For any stings or bites, Ledum can be used immediately. Typical symptoms include a cold feeling to the skin around the bite and cold applications to the skin provide relief.
 - For swelling, heat and stinging pain, use Apis.
 - Hypericum should be chosen in those cases where shooting pains develop along a nerve, common in horsefly bites.

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) Tissue Salts

The tissue salt Nat mur can be made into a paste by adding a little water, and applied directly to the bite to soothe the

Therapies

- Place a slice of fresh onion on the sting.
- To disinfect, dab the spot with alcohol.
- Apply ice to the area to slow absorption of the venom.
- For first aid, if nothing else is at hand, rub saliva into the bite.
- If stung inside the mouth, gargle with liquid whey or, if not available, with salt water (2 tbsp. salt to 3 cups of water).
- A cabbage leaf poultice applied to the neck will further help in reducing the poison's effect.
- For ant, mosquito, tick and chigger bites, wash the area thoroughly with soap and water. Use a brush and scrub chigger bites, then apply damp baking soda.
- Once a tick is found on the skin, it should be removed with tweezers by pulling the head, which is closest to the skin. Once removed the tick must be burned. Trying to remove the tick with the hands can cause the head to embed even more firmly in the skin.
- A capsule of vitamin E emptied onto the skin supports healing and alleviates pain.

Insect Bites (Spiders, Ticks & Fleas) Other Suggestions

Take charcoal tablets to draw the toxine out and chamomile tablets to reduce the irritation. Applying natural(greek) yoghurt to the bite immediately takes the inflamation down. Mosquitoes are attracted by sour sweat.

Wasp stings can become infected. If the inflammation seems to worsen on the second day, consult a physician.

the Battle of the Boyne, which took place near the east coast of Ireland in 1690.


It is now believed the conflict was sparked not by a faulty big-screen television, but by a series of marginal differences over the correct method of worshipping Jesus.


